- Reading the previous articles and Biblical passage on the Passover will give you a better understanding of why this tradition was so important in the Jewish faith. Make sure the group has a good understanding of Passover, how it started, and why Jesus and his disciples were celebrating it at the Last Supper. See if anyone in the group has any background in the Jewish faith or have participated in a traditional Seder meal.

-How did the Passover give hope to the people of Israel?

Read Vs. 16-18

- The “Kingdom of God” in this passage refers to the end times and when Jesus Christ returns for the final time. Jesus transforms the traditional Seder meal into a new tradition and remembrance of what the bread and wine stand for.

-How did Jesus reassure and give hope to his disciples?

-How does the tradition of participating in Communion now give hope to us in today's society?

Given for You

- The phrase ‘Given for you’ is used by Jesus in the passage and was mentioned in the message by Chris. In the sermon, he says life is “not about ourselves, but about giving ourselves up completely for others.”

-How do we make our lives not about ourselves?

-How does Jesus' use of the statement 'given for you' different from what we are capable of?

“Detained in our sin, our selfishness, with no way out, God delivers.”

What in your life can be a detainment?

- This is a time for the group to share and be vulnerable but don't force it. Make sure you have a solid answer to this question to break the ice and then open it up for the group to answer.
