Bible Story: Proverbs 31

- Preschool: Proverbs 31:8-9
- Grade School: Proverbs 31:8-9 (pg. 104 in *Foundations for Kids*)
- Adults: Proverbs 31

In Proverbs 31 we are reminded that we are to speak up for those who cannot speak up for themselves. We are to speak up for those who are bullied or needy; for those who cannot help themselves. Think about what it would be like if you were the one who really needed something or the someone that was being bullied. If you knew that there was someone who could help you, would you not want them to? When Jesus died on the cross, He gave us something that we really needed, but could NEVER do for ourselves. His perfect life, death and resurrection allows us to have forgiveness and a relationship with Him, if we ask Him and believe in Him. When we speak up for those who cannot speak up for themselves, we are showing them and others the kind of love Jesus showed us.

Ask:

- In these verses, what are told to do?
- Who are we supposed to speak up for?
- Why would someone ask you to speak up?
- How are some ways that you can speak up for those who cannot speak up for themselves?
- Why is it hard to speak up for others sometimes?

Activity:

- There are a lot of ways that we can speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves. One of the ways that our church is speaking up is by providing food for those who simply don't have enough. In your Family Worship

Experience kit, there is a list of food items that we need to be able to help these families. As a family, consider making a shopping list for some (or all) of these items to help out families who need our help. You can bring these items to the church or drop off during the Drive Thru Offerings on Sundays from 2-4. If you want, you can even include homemade cards, letting these families know that you are praying for them!

Memory Verse Game:

This week we are talking about speaking UP for those who cannot speak for themselves. Cheerleaders and leaders use a megaphone to help everyone hear their message (or cheer). Megaphones help make sure that no one misses an important message or instruction. This week, to help up memorize our verse, Proverbs 1:7, we are going to:

1. Color your megaphone. Color it bold and bright to help get everyone’s attention.
2. Tear apart your memory verse cards (they are perforated).
3. Lay down your megaphone first, and then, out from it, put the words of Proverbs 1:7 in order. Once all the words are down, shout out the verse! Keep scrambling up the words of the verse and race to see who can put them in order the fastest. Each time, after the verse is put together, shout out the verse and remind each other that we are supposed to speak up for those who can’t speak up for themselves!
