A ministry that shares the gospel on the street of Sioux Falls. Laundry with Love is just one of their ministries where they provide free laundry to people in need.




CLYDE'S ARTICLE

I don't know if this will be well attended or not, but I'm going to give it a try for several months! If you have any questions, please ask. I hope to see many women on February 7!

Now, men, you might have read about WD40 and thought, "Why isn't there something for men??" Well, let's talk about that! I would be thrilled to set up a similar type of group for men, but I need to know what kind of group would be valuable for you. If you have thoughts about this, let's talk.
