This week, I wanted to be sure to remind all of the worship team people to check their email. Last week I sent out an email with the date and information for our yearly meeting coming up in September, and I want to make sure you received it. If you did not receive it, please let me know so I can check my email address for you!

Remember to sign up for VBS! VBS will be held August 1-4, and that week will be here before we know it. We still need many adult volunteers to help out in various places, and of course, it's always a good idea to get your kids registered so Heather can be sure to order enough of everything for everyone!

And lastly this week, I wanted to share with you something I was surprised to consider about my own spiritual growth.

It's very common to talk about the time it takes to learn a new skill. We often encourage children to, "Stick with it," when they are working on a new skill or sport or activity. Right now, I'm thinking about how slowly kindergarteners read and write. It is time consuming work! And frankly, even 3rd and 4th graders often read and write very deliberately. It takes years to become proficient readers and writers, and that doesn't happen without hours of practice. And the kicker is that kids usually can't see their own progress because they are right in the middle of it! From the outside, we can see how far they've come and how much they've grown, but for them, it feels like they are making very little progress. When they have mastered the skill, they might take time one day to think about how far they've come and see their own growth. But I'm afraid that even that noticing is pretty rare. How many of us have really taken time to think about how far we've come as readers or writers?

What I was reminded of recently is that our spiritual growth is often the same. Many of us engage in spiritual practices daily to help build our relationships with God. We might read a devotional or a few verses from the Bible every day, we might pray every night before we go to bed, we may meet with friends for God discussions, we may be involved in a weekly Bible study, etc. I'm guessing there are some of you reading this who are thinking, "I used to do that, but I just didn't feel like it helped me feel closer to God, so I quit doing it." And this is exactly where I'm heading.

Friends, when we participate in those spiritual practices, it is crucial to remember that true and lasting growth takes TIME. And just like those elementary kids who are learning to read and write, we probably won't see our own growth until it surprises us one day, and we realize that we aren't the same as we used to be. God really has been changing us! It just took time for us to see it.

This week, I want to encourage you to "Stick with it!" Keep trying to get to know God. Try new practices. Go to coffee with someone new and see where the God conversation takes you. Read your Bible, just a little bit at a time, but do it every day, trusting in faith that even though you may not see your own growth, God is indeed growing you. And one day you'll find that you aren't the same as you used to be.

That's what got my attention last week. I realized that I am not the same as I used to be. I am growing and changing in ways that surprise me. But let me tell you that the progress was slow and hard to see. Yet, last week, I finally had eyes to see it. I am deeply thankful to God for that!
