MAZIE BOYLE FAMILY MEAL TRAIN/ FUNDRAISER


A group of friends started a meal train to support Mazie, a 6 year old, and her family through her cancer journey.

Attention MEN!

I am still gathering input as to the best days of the week and the best times of the day to have a group that meets for men's discipleship. The basic outline of this group would be a once monthly meeting that would start with a little food, followed by a devotional, and ending with a short time of prayer. If you weren't able to give me your input on Sunday, please feel free to email me or catch me next week. I'm also interested in your ideas about what you might like to study during this time. Please share your thoughts if this interests you!

Just a little reminder that we are down to 4 nights of Mid-Week! Our last night is April 6. It's hard to believe we are at this point of the year!

And lastly this week, I want to share another story about something my cat, Kenny, has taught me. You know, when I got that cat, I had no idea how much God would use him to show me things about my own life!

Several days ago, I noticed that Kenny's dry food dish was getting low. He has a self-feeding dish that has a large clear container to hold the extra food. As he eats, gravity feeds the new food into the dish. It's a great concept! Anyway, the clear container was almost empty, and I thought to myself, "Oh, I should fill that container so Kenny doesn't get worried that he's almost out of food." And then I stopped myself.

I realized that I was actually projecting my own worry tendencies onto my cat! Cats don't "worry" about where their next meal is coming from. Cats hunt and then eat when they are hungry. (And in the case of my cat, there hasn't been a day of his life where Kenny has had to go without food. (a) I don't think the cat brain is able to consider the future... at least not in the same way a human considers the future. Cats truly live in the present moment. I was worried that Kenny would get worried if his dish wasn't full to the top! And I'm sure Kenny couldn't have cared less. He was too busy napping and watching birds and playing with his toys. And frankly, there was still food in the bottom of the dish!

I found myself thinking about all the times I've been worried when my "dish" wasn't full. How many times have I been worried over the potential of pain that never came to be? How much emotion and effort have I wasted on planning for contingencies that never happened? How many times have I essentially said to God, "I see my dish is almost empty, but I don't trust You to fill it (even though you have done it over and over in my life), so I'll go ahead and fill it myself."

Ouch, right?

Planning is an excellent and necessary skill. We need to plan to be productive people. Yet so often, especially when we happen to be exceptionally good at planning, we don't leave any room for God to fill our "dishes." We get so caught up in all the doing, that we don't leave space for God to care for us.No wonder we get tired and worn down and worried. We're trying to do it all! So, this week, I challenge you to take a look at your life. Is there a "dish" that you've been controlling in your life that maybe God should be controlling? Money? Relationships? Work? Do you need to step back and let Him fill your "dish" in His perfect time? It might get dangerously empty! At least to your eyes. But if you give it to Him, He'll do something good with it. I know it. I will be joining you in this challenge too. 5
