Hi Everyone!

I don't have much for you in terms of big updates. We continue with Sunday School, Midweek and Christmas Program prep. As always, let me know if you have questions or if there is anything I can help you with.

This time of year can be a tricky one for many kids and adults. It is a season that includes memories, family gatherings, planning and activities which can bring smiles, bring tears, bring excitement, or overwhelm. However, on a more simple logistical level, the time change and weather often play a role in our moods. The change in weather can take a bit of getting used to. Even if you like the cold (I do not!), it is still a change. For kids, this might mean a little less time outside and at very least a change in activities and scenery.

If you happen to be spending quality time with a cranky kid (kids can be age 1 to 101), here are a few things that might help:

- 1. Take a moment to breathe and pray before you try to connect or correct. God made you, made your kid, and put the two of you together. He's got this covered.
- 2.Try to listen for what the real issue is. For one year old kids, it might be pretty clear. For teenagers, you may need to do some detective work. The rest of us fall somewhere in between.
- 3. Do your best to be the calm in their storm. The ironic thing that often happens when a kid is in a funk, is that the grown-ups are often in a funk too. Kid brains are still developing. They can be irrational, illogical and emotional. Our job is to be the grown-up and calmly set expectations that are age-appropriate, even when we feel like joining the drama. This probably isn't about you. Even if you do struggle, be ready to apologize....first.
- 4.Just add water. For some kids, a big drink of water is enough. For others, a bath or a shower may be the relaxing change up they need.
- 5. Try a little music. Bonus: dance along. It is hard to be mad and dance.
- 6. Change the scenery and/or add fresh air. Even a teenager can bundle up and walk around the block to shake off a bad mood. Little ones can bundle pretty tight in a stroller. Spending 5 minutes walking is far more productive than 10 minutes yelling or crying.
- 7. Drop the to-do list for a few minutes and just be together. Again, invest the time in good moments rather than wasting time dealing with bad moments when things get worse.
- 8. If you've got things that must be done, try shaking it up. Do your kids usually read 20 minutes for homework? Try reading with a flashlight under the covers. Need to vacuum? Race the clock for a silly prize like making dad wear a paper hat during supper. Is the drama around eating supper? Try ditching the silverware or eating with big, huge serving utensils. Silly is good, sometimes. If you have to grab groceries, give your kid the list or let them decide between a few acceptable items when possible. Big kids? Divide that list and conquer it as a team.
- 9. Speaking of choices, sometimes, when I'm in a funk, too many choices is overwhelming BUT too few is annoying. Walking that line with a kid can be tricky, but if you watch for cues from them. You know your people.
- 10. Ask some good questions like, "what is one thing that made you laugh today?" "If you could travel back in time, what's one thing you'd change this week?" "Is there anything you'd like some help with?"
- 11. When in doubt, try a snack and/or a nap (for them and you.)
- 12. Remember, this is just one moment. It'll change. Even if it is a longer phase, it'll still change eventually. Again, handle with prayer.
