NOTE: The evening book club will meet on the 2nd Tuesday (Dec. 14) in December to move away from Christmas week.




Hi Everyone!

Last week, I was hoping to get back to Burke for a quick visit to see my grandma, but a few things came up, and I had to postpone to this week. And you know, that got me to thinking...

My initial plans were to head to Burke after church on Sunday and stay in Burke for a couple of days. But there were small things that kept cropping up that made it harder and harder for me to leave town and make that trip work. Finally, at about 2:00 Sunday afternoon, I thought to myself, "Maybe God is trying to get me to see that this is not the best time to make a visit." So, I called my grandma and postponed the visit for the following week. After I did that, I noticed that there were even more small things that cropped up, which at that point weren't a big deal since I had already planned to postpone my trip.

Here's what I noticed though: because the circumstances that were cropping up were small, I easily could have plowed through them and kept my original plans. No one was dying. Nothing was urgent. These were not critical circumstances. But something in my soul was resisting the urge to "just keep going anyway." I think that inner resistance was actually the Holy Spirit urging me to postpone my trip.

Now here's the deal: I'm not entirely sure why it was necessary to postpone. And it's possible that I'll never know the full reason. But I strongly believe that there was a larger reason that God was urging me to postpone. Don't get me wrong. The temptation to "go anyway" was strong. But it just didn't feel right. How many times in our lives do we have moments like that where things just don't feel right, but we move ahead anyway? I'm guessing it happens more often than we'd like to admit. If you find yourself in a position like that, I encourage you to stop and maybe reschedule or postpone. Don't just push through even though you could. Maybe there is a blessing waiting for you because you are willing to listen to the Spirit in you. Right now, I'm keeping my eyes open to blessings that might not have been there had I made the trip in my time. If something pops up, I'll let you know.

Just a little reminder about our Mid-Week adult classes - because the class sizes were a bit larger than we anticipated (a wonderful thing!!) we have moved the locations of the classes. These classes run from 6:30-7:30pm.
