Sermon Title: "Developing a Holy Lifestyle"

Reference: 1 Peter 1:14-16

Context: Peter is writing to scattered, suffering Christians facing increased persecution. They are in need of encouragement and instruction as they live out their earthly pilgrimage in a hostile environment. 1:13-2:10 highlights at least six responsibilities Christians have been given as the result of God's great salvation. 1:14-16 focuses on a holy lifestyle that brings glory to God and spiritual health for the believer.

Sermon in a Sentence: "Christians are responsible for being different from the world by pursuing personal holiness."

Main Points:

I. Holiness is exclusive for all God's people. (1:14-16)

Ref. Matt 5:48; Rom 8:1; 2 Cor 5:21; Heb 12:14; Rom 8:28; 1 John 3:2

II. Holiness is expected for all God's people. (1:15-16)

Ref. Leviticus 19:1-2; 1 Thess 4:3-7

III. Holiness is possible for all God's people. (1:15-16)

Ref. 1 Pet 3:5; Heb 11:24-26; Gen 39:6-12; 1 Cor 9:27; Hebrews 7:26; Rev 4:28

A. Developing a holy lifestyle requires consistent obedience to God's Word. (1:14)

Ref. John 8:31-32; John 17:17

B. Developing a holy lifestyle requires constant denial of self. (1:14)

Ref. 1 Pet 2:11; Col 3:5-8; Matt 16:24-25; John 15:10-11
