A Study of 1 Peter: "Following Jesus Through a Foreign Land"

Sermon Title: "Loving One Another"

Reference: 1 Peter 1:22-25

Context: Peter is writing to scattered, suffering Christians facing increased persecution. They are in need of encouragement and instruction as they live out their earthly pilgrimage in a hostile environment. 1:13-2:10 highlights at least six responsibilities Christians have been given as the result of God's great salvation. 1:22-25 focuses on loving one another in the church.

Sermon in a Sentence: "Christians are responsible for actively and genuinely loving one another" Main

Points:

I. The ability to love is a gift from God's Spirit. (Vs 22)

Ref. Ezekiel 36:25-27; Romans 1:5; Acts 2:38; 1 John 4:19-21; Galatians 5:22

II. The focus of our love should be centered on God's people. (Vs. 22)

Ref. 1 Thessalonians 4:9-10; John 13:35; Galatians 6:10 III.

The nature of love has been defined within God's Word. (Vs. 22)

- We are commanded to love biblically.
- We are commanded to love sincerely.
- We are commanded to love earnestly.
- We are commanded to love honorably.

Ref. 1 Corinthians 13:4-6; John 15:13; 1 John 3:18; Romans 12:9; Acts 12:5; Romans 12:10

IV. The reason to love is based on God's eternal plan. (Vs. 23-25)

Ref. Ephesians 2:4-5; 1 Corinthians 13:8
