
*Prayer of Confession

Second Lesson Exodus 17:1-7

From the wilderness of Sin, the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. The people quarreled with Moses, and said, 'Give us water to drink.' Moses said to them, 'Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the Lord?' But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?' So, Moses cried out to the Lord, 'What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me.' The Lord said to Moses, 'Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile and go. I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink.' Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled and tested the Lord, saying, 'Is the Lord among us or not?'

My Soul Doth Magnify the Lord- An Organ Recital: Today at 4:00 pm. Fargo native and organist, Benton Schmidt, will present a collection of liturgical music inspired by the Magnificat, the Virgin Mary's "song of praise" recorded in the Gospel of Saint Luke. Many composers have written organ settings of this hymn, and this recital will present those of Dietrich Buxtehude and Heinrich Scheidemann, two German masters of the Baroque era. The late Italian Renaissance will be represented in selections from an organ Mass by Girolamo Frescobaldi. Also included will be the Ave Maris Stella versets of Marcel Dupré, one of the greatest organists of the 20th century. No organ recital would be complete without Johann Sebastian Bach, so this concert will begin with the exciting Toccata in F, and end with the companion double Fugue. This event will showcase our church's 2007 Schantz organ. It is free and open to the public.

This will be a fun hour of fellowship among families as we create with crafts, feast on finger food, move to the music and prepare to parade our palms down the aisle at the beginning of the worship service.

There will be NO Sunday School on Easter morning. Families may choose between two identical worship services, 9:00 and 11:00 am.
