

READ SCRIPTURE ALOUD TOGETHER:

*Bible Skills Tips: Use Table of Contents to locate the book of Luke. Identify if Luke is an Old or New Testament book. Share the book of Luke is written by Luke, who was a doctor and follower of Jesus.

Luke 10:1-3a: ¹ After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go. ² He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. ³ Go!"

BIBLE TRUTHS

- 1. Jesus gives us a mission.
- 2. Jesus gives us a friend.
- 3. We can ask Jesus for help.

BIG PICTURE QUESTIONS/PRAYER:

Who sent the 72 out two by two? What were each pair sent out to do? Where did they go? Why do you think Jesus sent them in pairs? What could happen if we do not go or complete a task we have been asked to do?

Dear God, Thank you for Jesus. Thank you for loving us. Thank you for giving us our families. Help us to follow Jesus' example of going out to help and tell others about you. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

ACTIVITIES (and materials needed):

- 1. Go and Find! (post it notes or index cards; writing utensil)
 - Write one word on each card of Luke 10:1. Spread out cards in various places around the room or house. Go two by two to find all the words, and together as a family place the words in the correct order. Recite verse together.
- 2. Pass and Tell! (a soft ball or object to pass; music)

Play this game like Hot Potato. Start the music and pass the ball around the circle. When the music stops, the person holding the ball answers the question for that round. The question per round are as follows:

- Who can we help?
- Who can we tell about Jesus?
- Who can we pray for?

Play each round until each person has answered the question.

3. Partner Up! (no materials needed)

In teams of two, see how many household items you can list or collect that go together. For example, salt and pepper shakers, pillow and a blanket, toothpaste and toothbrush, pencil and paper, etc.)
