


A. BIBLE TRANSLATION CONTINUUM



B. BIBLE READING PLANS

- The One Chapter A Day Reading Plan (15-minutes/day): As the name implies, read one chapter of one book of the Bible every day. This plan is ideal if you are beginning the habit of daily Bible reading, since the relatively short readings help prevent burnout. If you miss a day just pick up the next day where you left off. Visit <u>https://clearcreekcoc.org/spend-time-with-god</u> for 4 different One Chapter A Day plans.
- 2. The One Year Bible Reading Plan (about 35-minutes/day): Read 3-4 chapters every day beginning in Genesis. This plan is ideal for those who have 30+ minutes a day. I recommend the "Read Scripture" phone app. It provides the daily reading and user-friendly, bite-sized videos that explain key ideas and new sections of the Bible.
- 3. The Discipleship Journal Bible Reading Plan (about 35-minutes/day): This One Year Bible reading plan incorporates Old and New Testament Scriptures in each day's reading. I like this plan because I seem to always get something from my reading (i.e. if not from the Old Testament text, then from the New Testament).
