

c.	His Christian Faith: Bacon was a devout Anglican. He believed that philosophy and the natural world must be studied inductively (using the scientific method). He argued that we can only study arguments for the existence of God. Information about His attributes (Character, personality, and will) can only come from special revelation such as the Bible.
