•	We shared research on how 8 out of 10 young adults walk away from their faith and a gap of irrelevance was identified between faithful habits and the rest of the life. How did you incorporate discipleship into your family rhythm without it seeming "forced down their throats" or like a checklist?
•	How did you maintain intentionality during busy seasons or parenting?
•	In hindsight, what is something you would have been more intentional about?

<ul> <li>In what ways were you able to observe spiritual growth in your kids as they developed towards maturity?</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>What have you learned <u>from</u> your kids about God, faith, and being a disciple?</li> </ul>
