

WHY DO [OR DON'T] YOUNG ADULTS GO TO CHURCH?

Out of 20 on-ramps and 22 off-ramps, young adults in the US identified these as the top 5 on-ramps and off-ramps.

What do young adults say are their top on- and off-ramps to church?

WHY DO [OR DON'T] YOUNG ADULTS GO TO CHURCH?

While young adults may self-report other reasons as being the most significant predictors of their attendance, the data suggests these on-ramps are what actually predict attendance.

Young adults in the US who agree with these statements are **more** likely to attend church frequently

Church is essential for my growth as a person



$r = 0.681$

Fellowship with other people is important



$r = 0.656$

Church feels like 'home'



$r = 0.594$

My family attends church



$r = 0.526$

I feel welcomed by the leaders in the church

WHY DO [OR DON'T] YOUNG ADULTS GO TO CHURCH?

These off-ramps are negatively correlated with young adults' church attendance.

WHAT DOES CHURCH PROVIDE FOR YOUNG ADULTS?

Research indicates that these are the top 11 values for young adults.

- Autonomy:** I value my independence and the capability to make my own decisions.
- Stability:** I value job security; financial security (for both my needs and wants); commitment to people or organizations with a solid reputation and pattern of growth.
- Relationships/belonging:** I value warm satisfying relationships, accountability, and belonging; I value being accepted by others even when discussing difficult topics.
- Peace:** I value self-acceptance, restoration, and relaxation.
- Purpose/meaning:** I value having a sense of purpose/direction and meaning in life.
- Fun:** I value allowing time and space to be creative, adventurous, and to play.
- Spiritual growth:** I value developing higher awareness/consciousness; engaging in spiritual practices (meditation, prayer, etc.); acknowledging a higher power/god.
- Personal transformation:** I value being able to develop and connect my body, mind, and spirit.
- Social transformation:** I value helping others in need; pursuing justice and beauty in the world through the creation of networks for good; a chance to be part of something bigger than myself.
- Networking:** I value having access to networks of organizations, mentors, career development, and people with similar interests; use of social networks to find community.
- Unique contribution:** I value having my personal significance recognized by others and adding value to a group/community; being seen by others; having mastery.



WHAT DOES CHURCH PROVIDE FOR YOUNG ADULTS?

Young adults in the US find less satisfaction than importance in all 11 values **except spiritual growth**.


They see spiritual growth as the **least important** of the values.

11 Top Values: Importance vs. Satisfaction

Top values were assessed based on ratings of importance and satisfaction derived from literature. Data was gathered from a combined sample of young adults in the US and PNW (N=296).



WHAT DOES CHURCH PROVIDE FOR YOUNG ADULTS?

Young adults' values are fulfilled by various roles (communities or places) in their lives. The top values they reported as being fulfilled by the church are:

- spiritual growth
- peace
- social transformation

These values are somewhat uniquely fulfilled by the church as they do not show up as a top value for many other roles.



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



WHAT DOES CHURCH PROVIDE FOR YOUNG ADULTS?

Young adults say these are their most common third places:

- 1 The Gym
- 2 Outdoors
- 3 Social Groups
- 4 Exercise Class/Sport
- 5 Yogo Studio/Meditation

Church vs. Third Place in Fulfilling Top Values



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


WHAT DOES CHURCH PROVIDE FOR YOUNG ADULTS?

Young adults in the PNW feel all their top values are less fulfilled by the church compared to young adults in the rest of the US.

Well...

Top values were assessed based on ratings of importance and satisfaction derived from literature. Data was gathered from a combined sample of young adults in the US and PNW (N=296).

HOW DO YOUNG ADULTS GROW IN THEIR FAITH AT CHURCH?

These 12 statements act as a faith maturity scale measuring faith growth within young adults.



"I help others with their religious questions and struggles.

"I seek opportunities to grow spiritually.

"I feel a sense of responsibility for reducing pain and suffering in the world.

"I give significant portions of time and money to help other people.

"I feel God's presence in my relationships with other people.

"I feel my life is filled with meaning and purpose.

"I care a great deal about reducing poverty in my country and throughout the world.

"I apply my faith to political and social issues.

"The things I do reflect a commitment to Jesus Christ.

"I talk with other people about my faith.

"I have a real sense that God is guiding me.






HOW DO YOUNG ADULTS GROW IN THEIR FAITH AT CHURCH?

Each of these nine faith practices significantly predict young adults' faith growth in the U.S. sample. This graph displays how frequently young adults engage in each practice.

The numbers on each bar indicate the strength of the relationship between that practice and young adults' faith growth (the higher the number, the more that practice predicts higher faith growth).

Prayer, worship, and reading scripture are the strongest predictors of faith growth in young adults.

HOW DO YOUNG ADULTS GROW IN THEIR FAITH AT CHURCH?

Once young adults are involved in a church, how can churches support them as they grow in faith? Three types of church practices contribute to young adults' faith growth:


Faith growth practices
(33% overlap)

Community-building practices
(14% overlap)

Practices for openness
(12% overlap)

Data was gathered from a combined sample of young adults in the US and PNW (N=352).
