But faith might instead be an action-faith is doing something in the midst of doubt. In the study of organizations, trust has been defined as "making yourself vulnerable." Faith might be a willingness to ask the toughest questions and live with the answers. Maybe agnostics and seekers are more faithful than unquestioning followers.

We live every day with faith in a lot of things: That "until death do us part" will last; in the sanity and skill of the other drivers who are going 60 mph beside us on the highway; or that we will continue to stay healthy.



A story about Peter and his failed attempt at faith...or was it?

Peter was one of the 12 disciples that followed Jesus. He was, let's say, impulsive. He regularly got things very right or very wrong. One of the most memorable moments is when he tried to walk on water. His faith started so well...

- 14 ...Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone, and the boat was already a considerable distance from land, buffeted by the waves because the wind was against it.
 - 25 Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear.
- 27 But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."

- 28 "Lord, if it's you," Peter replied, "tell me to come to you on the water."
- 29 "Come," he said.
- 30 Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, "Lord, save me!"
- 31 Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. "You of little faith," he said, "why did you doubt?"
