

Getting Started

This guide is about your "**third place**," or the place aside from work and home where you spend the most time and get the most value. These places are essential for getting our needs met, and often form our community. This guide will help start a conversation around what you value, where you are going for those values, and how Christian communities may serve as third places.

For some it's church. For others it's pub trivia, a coffee shop, the library, CrossFit, gaming, a book club, or yoga. In today's world there are so many options for third places.

Third places are important, especially if you live in individualistic societies and cultures where you feel isolated even when surrounded by others. Third places are restorative in reconnecting you with others, particularly those who are unlike you.

A recent survey of 296 young adults (23-29 yearolds), indicated that these are some of the most common third places for this age group:

- The Gym
- The Outdoors
- Social Groups
- Exercise Classes/Sports
- Yoga Studios/Meditation

Church as a Third Place

The church used to be a common third place.

Most big events took place there, nearly the whole town attended, and the church was capable of meeting many core values. It served as a place where everyone came together and formed community. However, as other places are now better at meeting young adults' values (such as yoga providing peace), the church seems to have become a less popular choice.

One main purpose of a third place is community, which is something that is valued in Scripture:

"24 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, 25 not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Hebrews 10:24-25, NIV

"42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. 
