Habitat for Humanity of Logan County is an affiliate of



the HFH International founded in 1976 by Millard Fuller. The local affiliate was formed on 11/19/1992. In those 29 years HFHLC has built 16 new homes in Lincoln, three homes in Mt. Pulaski and one each in Atlanta, Elkhart, and Emden.

new homes in Lincoln, three homes in Mt. Pulaski and one each in Atlanta, Elkhart, and Emden. They've also rehabbed three homes in Lincoln for a total of 26 families having partnered for a better home. Eleven board members represent five communities in Logan County. HFHLC is a humanitarian based organization founded on the words of Christ: "Go into all the world..." Words without works is dead—today our hands are Christs' hands as we lift up those who are living in substandard conditions. Working for the vision of "No More Shacks" we also tithe, which results in for every home built in USA there are three built elsewhere in the world. Our tithe's have benefitted the Dominican Republic and Philippines. Not a hand out but a HANDS UP program, we welcome other hands to share their talents. Center for Youth & Family Solutions



Here at CYFS, our biggest goal is the reunification of healthy and safe families. We work with Foster Care cases on behalf of DCFS (Department of Children & Family Services), but what makes us different is our commitment to safe reunification. We serve families in Logan County, Sangamon County, and across central Illinois and help families reunify when possible. When reunification is not possible, we work with foster parents to get to the place where adoption is possible. We have a team of foster care family workers, licensing workers, and support staff who make sure every day that families and children in our area are in a place where they are safe and secure, and connected to community resources. This Christmas we are making sure EVERY kid we work with in foster care at a home away from their biological parents gets at least a couple presents from the loving folks in our community. ~Adam Pemberton
