Great Comebacks!

Most of my childhood was watching NASA launch rockets. My first memory of answering the question, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" I answered, "An astronaut!" However, God didn't give me the math or engineering skills I needed for that. Not even close!

In 1957, the Soviet Union launched a satellite named "Sputnik" and although it was only the size of a beach ball, the American psyche was deeply damaged by it. We felt spied on and unsafe. Our first attempt was called the Vanguard rocket, but because it only lifted four feet off the ground before exploding, it was nicknamed "flopnic."

Later, President Kennedy announced a new course for America: "We go to the moon, not because it's easy, but because it's hard." It was a move to reclaim space. When he announced that, we had just had our first successful mission; a man in space for 15 minutes. Now we're going to leapfrog to the moon?

It was called the great space race against the Soviet Union, and we were behind in every way. They beat us to having a working rocket. They beat us to space. They beat us in putting the first man in space.

And now, we're in a race to the moon? Can we get a man there and back safely? This was my childhood.

First, the Mercury Program: reach space and return to earth safely.

Second, the Gemini Program: testing man's ability for long flights in space.


Third, the Apollo Program: landing a human on the moon.

It took 10 years from our first failed rocket to the day we accomplished it. But America had it's comeback. How many things had to go exactly as planned for that to happen? Millions of things!

Catch this: the cross of Jesus and his resurrection was planned out in more detail than anything NASA did. God's plan from the beginning of time was for

us to have Easter. To move Jesus from a tortuous death back to a resurrected life, everything had to go as planned. And it did! In a world full of great comeback stories, Jesus is the greatest comeback of all time. His comeback is the beginning of ours!


Grounds & Landscaping Team



This image, and several very similar ones have floated around for a long time. Yet, every time I see it,



over and over again, it causes me to pause, question, and reflect. There are parts of our lives and our children's lives that must be filled. Some refer to it as the 'God-shaped hole.' As God's creation, we have a need for Him; our children have a need for Him. But how do we fill that space? This picture is a reminder that filling the space happens by intentionality. It happens by intentionally pouring into our kids. It may be at home, reading the Bible together, having family devotions or praying together. It may be through times when the Church gathers, and kids join with their peers to discover what the Bible says to them about how to live their lives as Christ followers. It may be by kids witnessing the actions of others in the Christian community. I wrestle with 1 John 3:18. The Amplified Bible states it this way . . .

Little children (believers, dear ones), let us not love [merely in theory] with word or with tongue [giving lip service to compassion], but in action and in truth [in practice and in sincerity], because practical acts of love are more than words.

It is said many of the most important things we learn in life are more "caught than taught." When I see the above picture, it always initiates a time of self-reflection, a time when I must ask: what are kids catching from me? How are they learning to follow Jesus because of what they see in me? Is Jesus reflected in the way I love and serve others? Do my actions and words match?

It takes parents, volunteers, and the church together to fill our kids. The world will seek to lead them away, but we can be the fuel to fill them with Jesus. Know that your role, whatever it is (parent, volunteer or believer), whenever you encounter each child, it matters. Our kids are watching! Thanks for investing and making a difference!

GLOBAL IMPACT

David and Sharon Filbeck continue to serve in Thailand but with Thailand Sustainable Ministries (TSM), a new organization they have formed along with another missionary couple. This organization is committed to establishing church communities that are financially and spiritually self-sustainable and do not rely on foreign support. TSM focuses on evangelism among the Lua and Lahu people, the San Pa Ha church plant, and an emphasis on Family Life Ministry. To help support these projects, David has started cultivating cocoa. The goal is for the cocoa cultivation eventually to fund the ongoing work in Thailand. To help with the cocoa cultivation, Lincoln Christian Church's Global Impact Team recently sent funds to purchase a moisture meter used during the cocoa bean drying process. They are currently drilling a deep well on the property for the critical task of irrigating the cocoa trees. David notes that cocoa cultivation is a long and slow process requiring patience and diligence much like ministry does.

Recently, one of the Lua churches had eight baptisms and is experiencing increased attendance. COVID has increased the number of homeless people in Chiang Mai. The San Pa Ha church raised funds to buy and prepare boxed meals they hand out to individuals as a ministry.


