Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

I was driving down my street this week and noticed vehicles stuffed with laundry baskets, lamps, comforters, and bikes strapped onto the backs of vehicles. Minot State students are beginning to return and gather.

Friends and family are visiting and traveling to be with loved ones.

I walk around the neighborhood and I see little ones splashing in their little blow-up pools and running through the sprinklers with siblings and friends.

I share this because I marvel at how different we are, and yet how connected we are. When we come together, God takes our offerings and multiples them in ways we might not even anticipate.

This has been my experience since arriving at Vincent in November.

- Beginning with the new year, over 100 individual people from across Vincent came together, pressed into God's presence, and considered the impact of prayer for 40 consecutive days. God took our individual efforts and multiplied them.
- Through the winter, into the spring, and continuing through the summer, individual formal and informal leaders are helping to lead worship, caring for one another, caring for the building and grounds, and reaching into the neighborhood, community, and world. Working together, God receives our individual efforts and multiplies them.
- As the Spirit continues to stir among us, God continues to take our individual efforts and multiply them.
 - · We experienced this when Vincent started providing and serving through the Warming House ministry.
 - o Our individual hearts broke and we responded when we saw what was happening in Ukraine.
 - o Individuals are offering time, groceries, and/or money, and God is multiplying these blessing box gifts in amazing ways.
 - o Individuals continue to come together every week quilting to be a healing presence in our community.
 - o Individually, flowers have been planted and the grass gets mowed. Together, God uses these efforts to create an inviting and welcoming atmosphere.
 - o Currently, we see hair salons offering haircuts, shoes being purchased, and school supplies being bought. How God will use these is yet to be revealed.
 - · We've talked individually and in groups about our concern for the future generations of the church. We've talked individually and corporately about building relationships and introducing Jesus to generations of people who might not otherwise have these opportunities.
 - o Individually, we can make a difference. Together with God's help, our effort and real lives are impacted.

I hope you believe, as I do, that God has a vision for Vincent UMC.

As the Spirit continues to stir we pray for wisdom and guidance to join with the Spirit so together we can be a difference maker for the Kingdom in our community. Our faith is a faith of relationships.

We are in this together. We can't just point to a couple of people and tell them to do it. Together we're Vincent. Together we press into God and offer ourselves, our prayers, our gifts, and our witness, praying that God will multiply all that we offer.

I wonder if you might join me in considering our membership vows

Prayer: What if we each commit to praying our new breakthrough prayer every day? Together God multiples our actions.

Presence: What if we each commit to being in worship at least 75% of the time each month, whether it's at Vincent, or somewhere we might be visiting out of town? Witness: What if we each pray for God's guidance in what this looks like in our own lives, and then we act on it with this movement called Vincent? Individually we can do good things. Together God can multiply our efforts to help transform the Kingdom.

Leadership Meeting Minutes: July 12, 2022

Lance called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM. Lisa opened the meeting with a devotion on giving. Pastor Mark followed with a prayer.

Jim made a motion to approve the June minutes with a correction made to change Pastor Matt in the SPRC report to Pastor Mark. The motion was seconded by Rich. Motion passed.

SPRC Report: Ann has asked for a family medical leave of 2 weeks-2 months. SPRC is working on a plan to fill in her position.

Trustee Report: The daycare would like to put up a shade tree in the North lot. Trustees did not feel that there are any concerns. Daycare would purchase the tree. The daycare will bring back the specifics for the trustees to approve.

There is a leak above Pastor's desk in his office. Scott will look at the tiles in the ceiling and explore what needs to be done to stop the leak. The sanctuary also has a leak that needs to be addressed.

Scott will call Margie's to ask about the stained glass.

Dick Hieb found a lift at United Rental to put the LED bulbs in the sanctuary.

Sally Verstraete visited with the trustees about the ovens in the kitchen. They are unreliable. She had gotten quotes from Minot Restaurant Supply. The cost would be approximately \$20,000.00. There is approximately \$8,000.00 from the September and December 2021 bazaars. The money from the 2022 bazaars would also be used towards the ovens, and UMW would donate money. After the discussion, Scott will call Sally and ask her to get a quote from Minot Restaurant Supply which includes the removal of the present oven and the installation of the new oven. A final decision will be made at the August meeting. The leadership supports this project and there is some money available in the building fund for the project.

Finance: Ann reports: General Fund: \$43,551.75

Monthly Income: \$11,200.68 Monthly Expenses: \$17,761.41

Shortfall: \$6,560.73

After discussion of apportionments, Rich made a motion to pay apportionments in full for the 2021 - 2022 years which are \$25,453.00 for 2021 and \$14,576.22 for 2022 and to resume paying apportionments monthly. Lisa seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The money from Mildred Robert's CDs went into the special activities and asking account. The pension rebate from the Dakotas Conference in the amount of \$16,606.61 will be put in the children and outreach special activities account.

Michelle Sys has assisted with the clean up of the quick book's accounts. The income accounts have been rearranged, and Ann is working on the special activity accounts.

The soft audit is about 75% complete. The committee is waiting on the update of QuickBooks.

Giving statements were sent out with a letter from Pastor Mark.

The Dakota Conference Miracle offering which includes Health Flex, Pension and Insurance, and UMPIP has not been paid since February because Ann did not receive a bill and was unaware of the expense. She will pay the full amount through July in July. The monthly payment is approximately \$1,715.00.

Scott made a motion to approve the finance report. Michelle seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Linda Wade asked the leadership team for permission to apply for a grant from Saint Joseph Community Health Foundation in the amount of \$1,500.00-\$3,000 to help fund the quilts given by the Sowers of Love. Rich made a motion to approve the request. Jim seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor Mark went over the 2022 Goals Update with the leadership team.

The next meeting will be August 9, 2022, with small groups meeting at 6:30 PM.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 PM.
