#### Patient, Patiently, and Patience

Rom. 9:22 What if God, desiring to show his wrath and to make known his power, has endured with much patience the objects of wrath that are made for destruction;

2Cor. 6:6 by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love,

2Cor. 12:12 The signs of a true apostle were performed among you with utmost patience, signs and wonders and mighty works.

Eph. 4:2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love,

No longer seek God far away from you. Seek him within yourself, and abide in his presence. "Let yourself go; let God act. But your letting go must be perpetual activity, like a road unmoving yet leading on to somewhere, like a yes pronounced in concert, deliberately, forever.

God is what you seek as perfection, as being, as oneness, as love. God is on the point of your pencil, on the edge of your ploughshare, as Teilhard de Chardin said: "The only thing separating you from God is the placenta of his procreative force, his infinite respect for your individuality, space in which you can be free to say 'I love you', distance allowing him to embrace you as son or daughter, brother, friend, spouse. . . an autonomous person. I sought - yes, 1 sought, for he was seeking me. That is my answer. I found him because he was already there, waiting for me.

Pp. 82-83, I Sought and I Found

Prayer is a word of infinite variety, were it repeated into infinity with the same syllables and in the same tone of voice. What varies is the Spirit of the Lord which gives it life, and this is always new...

Understanding prayer well means understanding that one is speaking with God. Thus there are two poles. One very, very tiny and very, very weak: my soul. One immense and powerful: God.

But here is the first paradox, the first surprise: that he who is so great should have wanted to speak to me, tiny as I am. It is not I who wanted prayer. It is he who wanted it. It is not I who have looked for him. It is he who has looked for me first. My seeking him would have been in vain if before all time he had not sought me. The hope on which my prayer rests is in the fact that it is he who wants it. And if I go to keep the appointment it is because he is already there waiting for me...

Letters from the Desert

"God comes like the sun in the morning — when it is time.

We must assume an attitude of waiting, accepting the fact that we are creatures and not creator.

We must do this because it is not our right to do anything else; the initiative is God's, not ours. We are able to initiate nothing; we are only able to accept....In short, [God] is what creates, and we creatures are in an act of becoming."

Yet the prayer of waiting is not so much a prayer of accomplishment as one of presence, a prayer of being rather than doing.

This kind of praying requires patience, a vastly underrated quality too often confused with mindless toleration of misery. Yet in scripture, patience is linked with love. As Paul tells us in his first letter to the Corinthians: Love is patient; ...

Whether we are waiting for the tomatoes to ripen, our child to reach maturity, a new language to become fluent—or whether we are waiting for God, our patience is grounded in hope.

Waiting without hope is empty and futile. Only the assurance, however faint and wavering, that our patience will be somehow rewarded sustains us....

#### CONTINUE THE EFFORT

Over the years the greatest continuing struggle in the Christian life is the effort to make adequate time for daily waiting on God, weekly inventory, and monthly planning. Since this time for receiving marching orders is so important, Satan will do everything he can to squeeze it out. Yet we know from experience that only by this means can we escape the tyranny of the urgent. This is how Jesus succeeded. He did not finish all the urgent tasks in Palestine or all the things He would have liked to do, but He did finish the work which God gave Him to do. The only alternative to frustration is to be sure that we are doing what God wants. Nothing substitutes for knowing that this day, this hour, in this place we are doing the will of the Father. Then and only then can we think of all the other unfinished tasks with equanimity and leave them with God.
