COVID-19 REOPENING GUIDELINES & INFO SHEET

SCREENING

- We will screening and continually evaluate all of our staff for the virus and keep you in the loop if anything happens. We'll check temperatures daily, and if symptoms show, they will be removed and sent home. They will wear masks and gloves in all food related and cleaning times as well as during activities where permitted.
- **You will be responsible for screening all campers.** If any camper or leader shows signs/symptoms, we ask that they stay home or be sent home if they're with us. That will require taking temperatures and monitoring signs of your campers daily. If anyone had recent exposure to COVID, we ask that they stay home as well.

SANITATION

- Cabins - We will sanitize all accommodations before and after your stay with us. **It will be your responsibility to sanitize your sleeping accommodations throughout your stay with us**, so please be prepared for those situations. We will be putting in barriers in some accommodations to adhere to distancing recommendations.
- Venues - Watermarks Staff will sanitize all venues, seating, bathrooms, handles, knobs, etc. regularly with 70%+ alcohol sanitizer.
- Bathrooms - Watermarks Staff will sanitize all bathrooms, handles, knobs, etc. regularly with 70%+ alcohol sanitizer.
- Dining - Watermarks Staff will sanitize all seating, handles, knobs, etc. regularly with 70%+ alcohol sanitizer. We will pre-make plates and let small groups of students enter, get their plates and take them to our outdoor seating options if weather permits and/or follow the guidelines for indoor dining. We will have prepackaged utensils, salt, pepper and napkins, with individually packed condiments included.
- Activities - Watermarks Staff will sanitize all activities regularly with 70%+ alcohol sanitizer. We will do outdoor cabin checks for swim time instead of gathering in venues and maintain distancing protocols as phases come and progress.

MEALS

- Watermarks Staff will sanitize all seating, handles, knobs, etc. regularly with 70%+ alcohol sanitizer. We will pre-make plates and let small groups of students enter the Dining Hall, get their plates and take them to our outdoor seating options if weather permits and/or follow the guidelines for indoor dining. We will have prepackaged utensils, salt, pepper and napkins, with individually packed condiments included.
- Rain Plan: If weather doesn't permit outdoor seating, we will utilize all venues as additional eating spaces in the smallest groups possible following the guidelines for the phase we're in.

ACTIVITIES

- We will do outdoor cabin checks for swim time instead of gathering in venues and maintain distancing protocols as phases come and progress.
- We will be adjusting all activities to adhere to guidelines, so they are all available, just might look different to protect everyone and limit physical touch.
- We will follow the phase guidelines for group sizes and distancing protocols.
- Rain Plan - If it rains we will follow guidelines of distancing and minimize group sizes inside of our venues

ADDITIONAL FORM

- In addition to our consent form, we ask that every camper fill out the risk acknowledgement and turned in with the consent forms for campers and parents to know that sending their camper is a risk and while we do everything to prevent the spread of this, it's not on us if something does happen.

MASKS & PPE

WM Staff will have masks and gloves provided, and we'll have some masks on hand if needed. It is the responsibility of the camper, parents or groups to provide masks for everyone if they so desire or if the CDC, or local governments require us to have them.
