

- 6. What themes do you see in these verses? Which words and ideas are repeated?

James 1:19-27 — How does it apply to our lives today?

- 1. When have you experienced or shown favoritism? What happened?
- 2. What could you do this week to recognize and repent of partiality in yourself and in our world?
- 3. What does it truly look like to "Love your neighbor as yourself?"
- 4. When have you been shown mercy?
- 5. What does it mean to show mercy to others right now?
