1. Introduction:
  - a. Taking a look ahead:
    - 1) “This do ye in remembrance of me” Luke 22:19
    - 2) Memories can be such a source of joy and encouragement.
    - 3) Things we remember have a way of impacting our life.
    - 4) Have you ever thought it interesting that Jesus never told us to remember his birth but He did tell us to remember His death?
2. Remember, there is a preparation part for them and us: Matthew 26:17-19
  - a. Where are we observing the Passover?
    - 1) Jesus sends Peter and John to look for a man carrying a pitcher of water.
    - 2) There is a preparation piece for us as well.
3. Remember what happened at the supper? Matthew 26:20-25
  - a. Jesus sits down with His disciples to eat.
    - 1) “one of you shall betray me” –
    - 2) Do you find it interesting that they had no clue who the traitor was?
  - b. Application:
    - 1) How does this happen?
    - 2) This speaks to the depth that our hypocrisy can go.
    - 3) Judas was seated in a place of honor, to the left of the Lord.
  - c. Remember Judas’ decision to betray Jesus? Matthew 26:24-25
    - 1) Judas is guilty here of making the decision to betray Jesus.
    - 2) Did God know this would happen?
    - 3) Did Judas have a choice?
4. Remember what Jesus picks up?
  - a. The Bread and the Cup: Matthew 26:26-30
  - b. The Bread – God’s Promise – the Perfect Lamb of God.
    - 1) This simple piece of bread would come to represent the fulfillment of God’s promise.
  - c. Jesus, the Perfect Sacrifice:
    - 1) The standard is set very high - Exodus 12:5-6
  - d. The Cup, Jesus’ Blood: Matthew 26:27
    - 1) We find ourselves going back to the garden once again.
    - 2) Leviticus 17:11 –
