Prayer March for Justice and Peace

Join us for a Prayer March for Justice and Peace on Monday, July 6 at 7pm. In the midst of injustice and soul unrest, we desire to be a community that lives out Micah 6: "He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" This prayer march brings together our church and other churches and faith-based organizations in Durham to silently march and pray over our city. We'll begin at the Bull at CCB Plaza and make our way to the Durham County Jail, the Durham Police Department Headquarters, the Durham County Courthouse, and back to the Bull, praying and reading scripture at each stop along the way. All are welcome. Please wear a mask and comfortable clothing (2 miles of walking) and bring water. We also ask that participants maintain social distancing.
