We are deeply humbled by what God has done over the past 44 years and wholeheartedly believe that the best is yet to come.




Our Prayers for You...

Worship

We love to worship Jesus. That is one of the first things that people notice and what they say attracted them to Living Word. Each Sunday, we come together for a high-quality music experience with energetic praise, grateful adoration, and moments of quiet worship. We want you to encounter God when you worship.

You will learn from a variety of teaching pastors. We have a teaching team, rather than one main person who speaks most weeks. We teach the Bible in practical ways, not just so you have more Bible information in your head, but so the truth of the Bible transforms your life.

Over the years we have set aside a handful of evenings to come together for extended times of worship as a congregation. During the pandemic, we also started outdoor nights of worship by the pavilion on our church campus. These have become very popular gatherings and it is common to see little children all the way up to our seasoned senior citizens worshiping with lots of joy.

During outdoor nights of worship, we have food trucks in our parking lot and set up bounce houses for families with young kids. It's a fun and sweet time of fellowship and a very nice way to invite guests to Living Word for their first time.



Living Word Distinctives

So, who are we? What is it that makes Living Word the church you experience right now?

Big Tent

We are what has been called a "Big Tent" church. This means Christians from many different backgrounds and experiences come together. We have people from all sorts of church backgrounds and, of course, from no church background. We are broadly evangelical in our belief. We are anchored in the ancient creeds of the Church, like the Apostles' Creed, that summarize the core of the Bible's teaching, especially about Jesus. (Note: "Church" with a capital "C" denotes the universal Christian community.)

Main Things

We focus on the Main Things of the Christian faith, knowing that on many secondary beliefs, Christians have a variety of opinions. We have our preferences and will teach them, but the main thing is to keep the main thing, the main thing. And the main thing is the gospel, the good news of Jesus who died and rose again, accepting Jesus as Savior, and growing mature as we follow Christ over a lifetime. We want to be a church where we daily experience and encounter Jesus. After all, Christianity is all about being in a relationship with God.

Grace

We talk about Grace a lot at Living Word. Grace means that God's love is generous and unconditional to you all the time. Every day you have a fresh start, a second chance, a new beginning. And for many people who have experienced life as messy and hard, and felt broken, the good news of the grace and love of God is so attractive. Accepted, free, forgiven, and still in process. Life is still messy, but grace and love are always there for the messiness of life.

Next Generation

We have always had a major commitment to the next generation. Our talented Next Gen staff and a large team of dedicated ministry partners work hard to provide a safe, spiritually solid, and fun experience for your children.

A People on Mission, Locally and Globally

Missions has been absolutely core to Living Word from the beginning. We have had hundreds of people go on short-term trips overseas and we have a global missions fund to support a great team of missionaries. As far as local mission, as a church we are committed to the flourishing of York. There is so much more that needs to be done in our city and county, and we want to see the people of our community blessed and thriving.

Annual Christmas Eve Offering

A unique distinctive of Living Word is our annual Christmas Eve Offering. Each year we take an offering for our global and local missional partners and 100% of it goes to those organizations. We don't keep a penny. People are so generous that over the years we have raised millions of dollars and given it all away. We think this is the heart of what Christmas is all about.

Connect - Grow - Serve - Reach

In April of 2021, we sensed God leading us into a fresh vision and strategic direction for the future. The words Connect, Grow, Serve, and Reach are the ways we articulate this new strategic approach to church life and ministry. We work hard to ensure that almost everything we do has these four dimensions present.

Friends

One of the most important relationships we can have in life is a friend. We live in such an epidemic of loneliness in our culture today and friendships are vital and life-sustaining. It is very important to be known and loved and accepted by a friend who you trust. We encourage you to develop strong friendships here.

Family

The church is family. We have a big God and we are a big family. The family of God is such a generative metaphor for the church. We are the household of God where we show up to love one another, comfort one another, carry each other's burdens, encourage one another, and spur one another on to good works.


Home

In the Old Testament, a physical temple was God's home. In the New Testament, God dwells in a building made up of people (Ephesians 2:21-22) with Jesus as the cornerstone. It is a place where people are loved, accepted, and welcomed home. At Living Word, many people have said that coming here for the first time felt like coming home.

What Pulls Us Together

What pulls us together and what keeps us together? There are two things. First, it is simply Jesus. Our desire is for Jesus to be the center of our world, and all other differences fade to insignificance in the light of Jesus Christ, who is Savior, Lord, and God. We will be a church of deep connections when we keep Jesus at the center.

Second, it is love. Unconditional love. In the New Testament, Paul describes a "most excellent way" (1 Corinthians 12:31) and, after talking about the divisive spiritual gifts that are tearing believers apart, Paul talks about the better way of unconditional love in 1 Corinthians 13.


A puppy grows and becomes a dog. A sapling grows and becomes a tree. A flower seed grows and becomes, well, whatever it is. Here is the point: It is the nature of life and growth to become more of what it is.

What is the Church? Scripture says the Church is a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, and God's special possession. We are chosen and we are God's special possession.

First and foremost, we belong to God. All other identities and commitments are secondary. We are a part of God's family. Our allegiance, loyalty, trust, forgiveness, energy, priorities, and values must be centered on God and what matters to God.

We are a royal priesthood. Peter combines two different themes that the Old Testament kept apart—rigorously so. Those themes are kingship and the priesthood. Because Jesus is both King of kings and the great high priest, and because we are in Christ, we are royalty, and we are priests. It is an amazing new reality. Kings lead so others may flourish and priests mediate forgiveness and blessing so others can connect with God.

Maybe you are still a sapling. One day you will be a mighty tree of flourishing for others. As you grow in your Christlike character and skills, you should constantly ask: How can I lead so others flourish at Living Word? How can I be a source of forgiveness and blessing?



Baptism

Several times each year, we gather at Living Word or away from our campus at a pool for a Baptism Celebration. It's a time to share testimonies of faith and celebrate the new life we have because of Jesus. Water baptism is an extremely important milestone in the Christian life because it is a public symbol of a person's commitment to follow Jesus.

Rooted

Rooted is an important step as you follow Jesus and it's the discipleship process that shapes the life of Living Word. Beyond a program, seminar, or LifeGroup, Rooted is a catalyst for life change. Rooted inspires questions, conversations, and beyond-what-is-comfortable group experiences that are designed to help you find yourself in God's story. We hope to see you at a 10-week Rooted Experience soon.

LifeGroups

Doing life together is vital to the well-being of the church. Jesus calls us to gather, engage with the church, and reach out to impact our world. LifeGroups are circles of friends who connect, grow, serve, and reach together. Members of LifeGroups celebrate milestones in each other's lives and pursue God together in the company of friends.

Thursday Mornings in the Word

Led by Pastor Gordon Carpenter, this group has a time of worship, fellowship, teaching, and small-group discussion on the main themes Living Word is learning each season.



Women


Men

We love to see people come to know Jesus, find their gifts and calling, and then discover the joys of serving!




From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. Ephesians 4:16 (NIV)

We are here to equip you to reach your world with the good news and compassion of Jesus.


Evangelism and Discipleship

Evangelism is simply telling others about the good news of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Evangelism invites people to turn from their old ways, find forgiveness, and find freedom as they begin a saving relationship with Jesus.

Discipleship is the process of growing in Christlikeness once we have been saved by Jesus. Discipleship is the transformation process of becoming mature in Jesus.

Evangelism and discipleship are the responsibility of every Christian as we connect with the world outside the church. But it is hard. Most Christians have few good friendships with non-Christians. When we encourage everyone to be highly intentional about Just One person who needs Jesus, many of us don't even have Just One! This year, you want to have a Just One.

Who can you get to know as a friend? How will you do that? Who is around you that needs a friend? Are you learning how to have spiritual conversations with non-Christians? If you want to learn more, get a copy of *Mere Evangelism* by Randy Newman. Another avenue is to invite people to connect at Living Word. You will have a valuable role as a connector. Engaging with Our Community

Reach is among the highest priorities for Living Word. Our world has changed and our community has changed. We live in a secular (non-religious) culture. We live in an increasingly post-Christian culture. The beliefs, values, and systems of the Christian faith have greatly diminished in North America. The old ways no longer work. They haven't worked for some time. We need creative new ways of connecting with and reaching our community.

We desire to impact our local community of York for the Kingdom of God. This is where we live, work, play, have friends, have family (hopefully), and have the closest opportunity to make a difference. York is our corner of God's world. York is our home. York is Living Word's home. Here we are. Together, we want to make a difference.

Becoming Good Citizens

Honor governing authorities.

The first step in being a good citizen in our country is to have a growing understanding that our citizenship is ultimately in heaven with Jesus Christ. This eternal citizenship gives us the impetus to be good citizens here and now.

Our witness to the people around us is connected to being good citizens. 1 Peter 2:13-16 offers us a blueprint for citizenship:

	Submit to governing authorities, for the Lord's sake.
0	Do good in the community.
0	Show respect to everyone.
	Love people.
0	Fear God.

We live in highly polarized times where partisan division and anger is a daily occurrence. We who follow Christ are called to model a better way of citizenship. How good are you as a citizen of our nation? How are you treating others with whom you might disagree? How is God asking you to change and grow to better reflect his Kingdom in this earthly kingdom?

Good citizens do good in their community. We do good when we get involved in the organizations, groups, and systems that make for a strong and healthy community. Schools, non-profits, a variety of civic clubs and groups, local associations for special interests, the list goes on.

The people of Living Word desire to find a place to get involved. We want to build relationships and work together for good results. A local community flourishes when its people (citizens) work toward that end. Where can you get involved?

Taking Our Faith to Work

We believe God cares about what we do beyond Sunday. Most of us spend a good deal of our life working. We have places of employment. We earn a living through our work. Many people have meaningful work. Many even have a sense of calling and vocation.

We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give. One place where we learn to make a life is on the job. When your job becomes a vocation, your place of work becomes a location to do God's work.

What does it mean to do good work? At the least, it is work you do with excellence and work you do ethically. Good work honors God and blesses others. Our hope is that as a church, our faith empowers us to do good work and good deeds... beyond Sunday.

If you have a leadership role of any sort in your workplace, that is one of the most critical places you have for reaching our community. How can you be an agent of transformation that impacts not only the workplace, but also those who work there?

Living and Leading with Compassion and Justice

Why is justice and compassion such a hot potato for the Church today? Justice is mandated 130 times in the Bible. Not all social justice is biblical justice, but ALL biblical justice is for the sake of the society.

People are hurting. Life is not fair. The system is often biased against hurting and innocent people. It was true in Israel and Israel was chastised by God for their failures in this. If God judged his people Israel for these failures, then God's people the Church is in for the same.

Evangelicals through much of western history were on the side of justice. Evangelicals created hundreds of missional organizations for works of compassion and mercy that worked for justice for those who did not have it.

In Luke 4:18-19 Jesus proclaims his messianic mission as that of compassion and justice for those who need it. His entire ministry concentrated on those with the greatest need for both.

If the Church of Christ is to be a Church like Christ, then we must have his heart, his commitment, and his strategies that are full of compassion and result in justice. It will be hard. We will all be stretched. We have a lot of learning, praying, and activating ahead of us. But faithfulness to Jesus on this is essential. Our missional witness to our post-Christian culture will fail apart from it.

We love these words from Peter's first epistle in the New Testament:

. . . that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

1 Peter 2:9 (NIV)

The Church, by its very life and existence, REACHES OUT with the good news and the praise of the God who does wonderful things. The Church is to be a witness (1 Peter 2:11-12). A light shining in the darkness. An example and model of what life with God is like. When the entire Church is a community of great love, we show to the world the new thing God is doing.

Generally, in the United States, this has been extra challenging over the last few years. The Church has regressed. The Church's reputation is damaged. The Church in the United States, and Living Word Community Church in York, PA, must do better if we are to fulfill the mission of Jesus.

Here are a few areas where we can and must be better:

Racial issues and relationships, unity, trust.

We want to be multiracial/ethnic, diverse, and inclusive. We need each other.

Women in roles of leadership and influence.

The conservative church of America has been remiss for too long. Living Word has an enormous pool of women who are deeply spiritual, professionally skilled, and outstanding leaders at work and in the community. We are making room for women to work as equal partners to make us a better church.

Political polarization.

The Kingdom of God is much bigger than any political party or agenda. Holiness, shalom, righteousness, and justice—that is the Kingdom of God. No political party gets it right, but God's Kingdom gets it right. The Church is an outpost of God's beautiful Kingdom that wants everyone to flourish.

Reach Global

Becoming World Christians

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16 (NIV)

This is the most famous of Bible verses, and it is all about world missions. It is this verse that inspired David Livingstone, a famous, historic missional leader, to say: "God only had one Son, and he made him a missionary."

Jesus made it so clear to his followers that they were to love, serve, reach, heal, and bless the world. It is IMPOSSIBLE to be a faithful follower of Jesus and NOT have his heart for the world. If you love Jesus, then you love what Jesus loves, serve what Jesus serves, and do what Jesus did. And that simply means to love this world that is lost, hurting, and broken without God.

We use the language of being a World Christian for this type of Christ follower. Living Word has been passionate about helping our people become World Christians. A World Christian is informed and up to date about what is going on in the world God loves.

At Living Word, we try to keep you up to date about the specific places in the world where we are working. We call those places HUBs. A HUB is where we have a concentration of people and ministries that we supply with needed resources.

Being Globally Minded

In 2 Corinthians chapters 8 and 9, Paul spends two entire chapters instructing the churches in Corinth to give generously to missions by the giving example of the Macedonian churches, who were amazing in their generosity. What are the qualities of a Christian who is globally minded?

- We seek to be informed about world events and discerning of what God is doing in the world.
- We pray for the world Jesus loves.
- We endeavor to build relationships with those doing God's work around the world.
- We serve on mission trips or help to send people on mission trips.
- We join in financially supporting missions work around the world.

Living Word's missions budget was originally called "Faith Promise" because we would encourage people to make faith commitments to support our global work. In recent years, we have called it "Giving to Greater Things" because Jesus promised that, by faith, we would do greater things than he did (John 14:12). Living Word's growing commitment to global missions is a testimony to that promise!

Today we call our missions commitment REACH GLOBAL.

Our Reach Global budget is different than our general church budget, which supports the ministry at Living Word and in York. The Reach Global budget supports 24 people and organizations working around the world. We encourage you to be a part of giving to this budget. Pray about what God would have you give, then go to the website or church app and select Reach Global to make your donation.







KID::LIFE

kid::life is Living Word's children's ministry. Sunday morning programming is available for children birth through 4th grade.

Nursery (Birth-2 years old)

The nursery provides a safe and loving atmosphere where simple Bible truths are modeled and taught. Planting eternal seeds from the very beginning is important to us. We desire to partner with parents and help them feel confident in knowing we are on this journey with them.

Preschool (3–5 years old)

Our desire in preschool is to instill biblical concepts through age-specific learning. Classroom time is broken down by age and consists of activities and crafts that reinforce the biblical truths taught during large group. Children also engage in age-appropriate worship.

Kindergarten

Large-group time includes interactive worship, the teaching of God's truths, and exploring the influence these truths have on the children's choices and actions. Kindergartners use the small-group setting to put these truths into practice by participating in appropriate games and activities.

1st & 2nd Grades

Children participate in grade-level groups with instruction and activities conducted in large- and small-group settings. An emphasis is placed on children building relationships that will facilitate spiritual growth. Exciting worship, group games, and dynamic presentations characterize this weekly experience.



3rd & 4th Grades

Children participate in grade-level groups with instruction and activities conducted in large- and small-group settings. To build godly character, children participate in activities that help them learn to apply biblical truths to their everyday lives, as well as engage in dynamic praise and worship.

Base Camp

The Base Camp program is for children whose parents both serve on a Sunday morning, resulting in the child being at church for two services. This includes single parents and grandparents who bring their grandchildren to church. Base Camp is for children ages 3 (must be potty trained) to 6th grade. While in Base Camp, kids will enjoy lots of free play, a snack, and a drink. Our room offers a large play unit, video games, crafts, board games, toys, books, and more.

able::life

able::life is our special needs ministry serving children, teenagers, and young adults up to age 30. able::life provides safe and loving environments where individuals can experience God's love in their own unique way. Our service time is unique because of our high level of flexibility and one-on-one teaching of Bible stories. Our activities can be tailored to each individual's needs, abilities, and interests.

Child Dedication Services

The Child Dedication Service is also a parent commitment service. The service is viewed as a promise between you and the church to raise your child in a godly way. We dedicate children up to the age of 7. Dedications are held twice a year with a limited number of families per service.

Student Life

Transit (5th & 6th grades)

Transit is a weekly Sunday environment where 5th and 6th graders experience games, music, and teaching in a large-group setting before spending time processing what they learned in a small group. Groups are designed to create a safe space to share what's going on in their lives, as well as ask questions about faith and navigating their world. Our hope is to energize students to connect with their peers and God while in Transit.

Fusion Student Ministry (7th - 12th grades)

At Fusion, our mission is to make disciples by empowering students to love God and love others. We want to meet middle school and high school students where they are and provide opportunities to grow. Our programs are designed to help students:


- © Engage and connect with their peers

Living Word Online

Resources

If we are going to Connect, Grow, Serve, and Reach together as a church we are going to need some tools and some equipping. We are committed to continuously developing timely and relevant resources to meet you where you live with the help you need.

Some of the resources we offer each week are sermon notes, devotional resources, and LifeGroup guides. Everything that we develop is available in print and electronically via the website and Living Word App. We hope the resources we are writing and producing help to bring you closer to Jesus.







Prayer is the lifeblood of Living Word. Here are some ways to participate in or receive prayer.

The Prayer Room is available for personal prayer use any time our building is open. Please follow safe health practices. On Sunday mornings a Living Word prayer team member will be near the door if you would like to step into the room and pray with someone. We will wisely practice physical distancing while caring prayerfully for you.

The Prayer Wall in the main lobby has been uniquely created to capture the essence of the Lord's Prayer via the use of custom-carved metal, hand-cut stained glass, and proprietary lighting (displaying the collaborative efforts of York-based artists from Salvaging Creativity and Rudy Art Glass). Please stop by any time our building is open to write a prayer, roll it like a scroll, and gently insert it halfway into the small holes.

Healing Prayer

On fifth Sundays, we set aside a few moments of our Sunday services to anoint people with oil and pray for those who are seeking the Lord for healing.

Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven.

James 5:13-15 (NIV)

Generosity and Giving

Every Sunday each of you make an offering and put it in safekeeping. Be as generous as you can. When I get there you'll have it ready, and I won't have to make a special appeal.

1 Corinthians 16:1-4 (MSG)

At Living Word, we practice tithing for the support of Christ's body, the Church, as God commands. We recognize that giving 10% of our income is the biblical standard for giving.

Giving is one of the central themes in the Bible. Jesus talked more about this subject than heaven, hell, or prayer. To understand what it means to be a Christ follower, we must also understand what it means to be a giver.

Tithe

A tithe means a tenth of our income/labor belongs to God. We find this principle all through God's Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first in our lives (Proverbs 3:9-10).

Offerings

An offering is giving over and above the tithe. The Bible says that by giving generously, we are able to "take hold of the life that is truly life." You really aren't living unless you're freely giving (1 Timothy 6:18-19).

The Gift of Giving

The gift of giving is a spiritual gift that God gives to some people (Romans 12:8). It is a Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by giving of your material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God.



Why We Give

For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. Matthew 6:21 (NIV)

And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:19 (NIV)

We give so that God's Kingdom grows and expands, and his people flourish. This involves supporting the people who are doing the ministry of church and mission.

Every church depends on the faithful generosity of its people. The more generous the people are, the greater a church grows in its capacity to evangelize, make disciples, train the next generation, raise up leaders, and meet the needs of the hurting.

Giving generously is an act of worship that expresses our gratitude, faith, and love for God.

Begin with Prayer

- Invite God to be part of your financial decisions.
- Ask God to give you a plan for the stewardship of his money.
- Open your heart and surrender your fears to God.

Step Forward in Obedience

Make God's Kingdom your first priority when you face financial decisions.

- Be intentional and commit to giving a percentage of your incomewhether a tithe (10%) or another figure.
- Give fearlessly so you can experience joy in the act of giving.





Blessed to be a Blessing

God blesses the people of God (Israel in the Old Testament; the Church in the New Testament) so that all creation will be blessed. The concept of "blessing" through the scriptures is central. The Hebrew word is **baruch** and has the sense of bestowing well-being on a person or bringing God's shalom to a person or community. Blessing is the grace and lavish generosity of God poured out on people.

God is the source of all blessing, and we are his instruments or channels for people to receive that blessing. This is a high honor and responsibility for Christians and for the Church. We bless people around us as a core part of who we are as followers of Jesus Christ.

Blessing others is never an extracurricular activity. The apostle Paul summed up "blessed to be a blessing" like this: "God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8). We "abound in every good work" so that others will receive God's blessing, both now and into eternity.

Statement of Faith

We hold to the historic teachings of Christianity as articulated in the Apostles' Creed and the Nicene Creed.

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Amen.



We believe that:

- The 66 canonical books of the Bible as originally written were inspired by God, thus free from error. They are the only infallible guide in Christian faith and practice.
- There is one true God, Creator and Preserver of all things, existing eternally as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- That man, created in the image of God, through disobedience fell from his sinless state. This fall plunged man into a state of sin, spiritual death, and separation from God, bringing with it a sentence of eternal death upon the human race. From this condition man can be saved only by the grace of God, through faith in Jesus Christ.
- Jesus Christ is God. He is the Living Word who became flesh. His divine and human nature were perfectly united in One Person. He was born of the Virgin Mary; he lived a sinless life in full obedience to the Father; he was crucified, as the substitute for sinful man, shedding his blood for the forgiveness of sins. He was bodily resurrected from the dead and ascended to the right hand of the Father, where he presently rules over his Kingdom as King of kings and where he intercedes as Mediator, for the saints. He will again return to earth, visibly and bodily to consummate history and God's eternal plan.
- The Holy Spirit applies to man the saving work of Christ. He convicts and draws men to Christ, enabling them to have saving faith. He bears internal witness to the reality of the person of Jesus Christ to the believer. He imparts new life, indwells and empowers believers for service, and distributes gifts to the body. He affects growth and maturity for the believers, and seals them until the day of redemption. His fullness, power, and control are appropriated in the believer's life by faith.
- © Every born-again believer is called by God to live a godly life by crucifying the old nature, so as to not fulfill the desires of the flesh, and by living in the power and vitality of the Spirit, so as to bear fruit and glorify Jesus Christ.
- Jesus Christ is Head of his body, the Church. All believers are members of his body by virtue of their regeneration. As a member of the body, each believer has been given at least one gift by the Holy Spirit to serve in the Kingdom of God.
- As members of the local body of Christ, believers are responsible for one another, and are to gather together regularly for worship, teaching, community, and outreach.
- The ordinance of baptism is the outward sign of God's Covenant of Faith with the believer. It is commanded of all who repent and believe in Christ. It signifies the believer's death to the old life and entrance into the new life. The ordinance of the Lord's Supper symbolizes the believer's sharing of the divine nature of Christ. It is a continual reminder of the forgiveness of sins which he offers the world, and it proclaims his death until his return.
- At the end of the age, the dead will be resurrected, when there will be the separation of the righteous into heaven, and the unrighteous into eternal hell.
- Until such time, believers are commanded to fulfill the Great Commission by proclaiming the gospel and making disciples of all men and nations. The fulfillment of the Great Commission requires that all worldly and personal ambitions be subordinated to a total commitment to Jesus Christ, King of kings and Lord of lords.



Membership at Living Word

- Indicate that you are in general agreement with Living Word's Statement of Faith.
- Be committed to a lifestyle of generosity and good stewardship, sharing in the responsibility of funding the ministry of Living Word Community Church.

All applicants who have met membership requirements are received into the church at a Sunday worship service.
