Baptism: Water and the Father, Son & Holy Spirit By Rev. Tom Shinkle

"There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."

-Ephesians 4:4

Baptism in our Church remains one of the important foundations of Christian identity and lifestyle. Like the **Lord's Supper**/Eucharist/Communion, it is a sacred thing, or sacrament, because both are things Jesus participated in and more deeply instituted as part of this new thing God was doing that we call Christianity.

Both of these sacraments are outward and visible things, pointing to inward movements of God.

Neither of our sacraments are meant to be empty rituals or things to just go through the motions with, because both open wider the door of God's grace and connect people more deeply with God and the Christian Community. Neither guarantee salvation—that is a separate conversation and theology—but both are important in the life of individual Christians AND the Christian Community.

On **Sunday, May 22**, we will do a special celebration of Baptism for youth and adults, at the 10:45am worship celebration! This will be baptism with full immersion, unless someone is unable to get into the baptism tank. What we will be doing is a "believers Baptism." This is for all people who have not been baptized and want to take that next step in repenting of sin, asking for God's forgiveness, andthen moving into a new and deeper relationship with God.

What follows are a few good points to remember about our understanding and practice of Baptism:


Baptism opens the door for God's Holy Spirit to work. It is a matter of positioning! This is a summation of why we can in good faith Baptize infants and children: God's spirit acts within them and brings about a spiritual new birth. For babies and children, think of it as a deeper claim God has upon them and a new work of being connected to God happening. Thus, the promises the Church and the Parents make to raise the children in the ways and practices of a Christian are really important! Then, when that child is a teenager or after, they confirm that God's Spirit has been at work in them and that they want to continue on the path of Christian Discipleship.

For youth and adults, **Baptism is also the work of God's Holy Spirit and deepens and strengthens the spiritual connection** between the one Baptized and
God. Consider Romans 8:16: "The Spirit himself testifies
with our spirit that we are God's children." Another way
to understand it is we are now claimed in new ways
and everything about the Gospel is made more real
for us and we see life and living differently.

Because of what God's Spirit does through the water and the invoking of the Trinity-being baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit-we only do one Baptism. We do not "re-baptize" or insist that someone who was Baptized in another Christian denomination must be rebaptized "the right way" when they join our Church. To do this is to negate the work of God and in effect say that the ways of people or their Baptism rituals are what count.

If you would like to take this next step in your journey of

following Jesus and allowing the Holy Spirit to keep forming you into the image of Christ, you can be a part of this life-changing and meaningful event on **May 22**!

We all have heard the phrase "change is inevitable" several times throughout our lives, yet when the phrase becomes personal, many seem to struggle with its reality.

The struggle with change comes from the comforts of feeling safe and knowing things will more than likely remain the same. When things are comfortable and remain the same, there is less chance of feeling unsettled and more sense of security.

From an outsider's perspective, I probably appear to be an individual who struggles with change and settles for what's comfortable. I honestly can't disagree. I live on the family farm, and up until March 2020, I attended the same church for thirty-nine years. And let's be real, I am at Grand View because of a pastor I had as a teenager and have known for over twenty years.

The congregation I grew up in was both United Methodist and First Presbyterian, which also means we had two buildings. The session and the council worked together to make it work for decades. We alternated which building would host Easter and Christmas. Both denomination's traditions were honored, and it worked well for the Protestants in our small town.

Unfortunately in 2004, the Presbyterian Church was forced to close due to health code reasons and the financial burdens it would cost to update. We were left with one building for worship and the other abandoned. The closure of the church was emotional and unfortunately, many Presbyterians left to seek worship elsewhere, or quit attending church altogether. Although it would feel different only worshipping in the Methodist Church, my family decided to continue because we would not lose ties to our denomination.

It took a while getting used to seeing the church sitting deserted. Eventually a man in town bought the building and its future use became desolate. Just a few weeks ago the stained-glass windows were removed, and soon it will be demolished. Once again, the feelings of despair resurfaced for many of us Presbyterians who remember the agony from its closure.

I recently ran into Larry, one of my high school Sunday School teachers. We conversed about the demolition and the emotions that have come with it. I thanked Larry for the biblical education and his part in my faith journey. It led to reminiscing on the years we had together in the of the Presbyterian Church. I learned so much from Max and him about applying the Bible to our everyday lives. It hurt to realize the church that built me was being demolished. As we departed, Larry said, "I am proud of you, Kid. You did well," and put his arm around me. The words seem simple, but his smile and the look in his eyes said everything I needed to hear.

I admit, at times I miss attending my home church. It doesn't seem like I have been gone long, yet it also feels like a lifetime ago. I began thinking about why I miss my home church: the feeling of love, sense of home, singing hymns, beautiful stain-glassed windows, and sitting in wooden pews worshipping the Father.

Then it hit me, I have all of that right now. It's not my home church that has conflicted me, it's the concept of change. The people from the congregation are still a part of my life and live near me. The church that built me is not being demolished, the building is. **The church that built me remains in my heart.** According to the Bible, the church is a body of believers that live out the Gospel in their words and actions. The body of believers from my childhood is what built me and are essential to my faith journey.

While the location of where I worship has changed, <u>Who</u> I worship has not changed. God often uses humor in my life. He knows that I struggle with change, therefore, He gave me the "things" about my home church that comfort me in a different location. The moment I stepped into Wesley and Center Grove, a sense of home overwhelmed me.

Every week I am embraced with outpouring love from His children. I am beyond blessed and grateful. The verse that comes to this farm girl's mind is Ecclesiastes 3:1 "There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the heavens." While change occurs in our lives, our God is constant and will not leave us. Where we worship God doesn't matter, it's the act of worship that does. It's being the church and living out the Gospel in our words and actions. Jesus wasn't complacent about where He spread the Gospel, and neither shall we. To God be the Glory!



Inside the Tech Booth

Have you ever wondered how the slides show up on the screen during worship celebrations, how the lights go on and off on cue, or who regulates the sound and balances all of the microphones used in the band? If you have never thought about it, it's because those who serve in the Tech Booth at Grand View, including paid staff, work very hard to ensure audio, visual, and technical excellence during worship celebrations. Their work is often times so seamless, it is not noticed. We want the focus to be on worshiping Jesus and not on the technical operations.

Here is a bird's eye view of what happens in the Tech Booth, located on the second floor, on the right side of the worship space. On any given Sunday morning (scaled down on Wednesday nights and for other events), they fill multiple roles.

The **Creative Director** (Alec Amosson) directs the praise band, leads worship from the stage, and manages the Tech Director & servers.

The **Tech Director** (Daniel Young) is responsible for sound quality, and ensuring that the overall audio/visual/technical presentation runs smoothly. He works with the praise

band to ensure that monitor levels are correct during sound check, and perfects the sound for both the "house" (worship space) and the online broadcast.

The **Computer Operator** handles the slides on the display screen, lining up the lyrics when the praise band is leading us in worship through song, and working with Pastor Tom to present the visual aspects of worship and his message.

The **Lights Operator** coordinates the LED lights display while the praise band is performing, the stage lighting for Pastor Tom, and the Bible lights to aid the congregation in following the verses selected for his teachings.

The **Producer** controls what goes out on the livestream. He or she switches among the three cameras, working with the camera operators to select the best shots, and post the slides for viewers during Pastor Tom's message and announcements.

The **Robocam Operator** moves the two robotic cameras in the worship space (back wall, right and left). He or she works with the Producer to get the appropriate shots of Pastor Tom and the praise band, making

adjustments on the fly for any special shots needed during Pastor Tom's message or Communion.

The **Camera Operator** works in the worship space, controlling the manual camera set up in the back. He/she works with the Producer to get shots of Pastor Tom, the praise band, and the congregation.

There have been some big changes in the Tech Booth operations over the last couple of years. Livestreaming of worship celebrations, which moved to the forefront during the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic, has allowed many to participate in worship remotely. The addition of a digital sound board has greatly enhanced our ability to adjust and perfect the sound quality in the worship space and over the livestream.

The broadcast of Pastor Tom's message to East Dubuque Wesley & Center Grove has facilitated our burgeoning partnership with our campuses. We also have tech servers on site at the campus churches, ensuring that everything runs smoothly during worship celebrations.

Thanks to the leadership of Alec Amosson, Daniel Young, and the



time devoted by those who serve, the Grand View Tech Booth is able to assist in creating a high-quality worship experience, and the delivery of God's word and Jesus' teaching, to our members and visitors.

There are 33 people who have said "yes" to handling the technical aspects of the worship celebrations at GV, CG, and ED. The Grand View Tech Booth is usually staffed by five people on Sundays, while there are two tech servers needed at both Center Grove and Wesley. They range from middle school to middle age, of various backgrounds and interests. Many have been serving for several years and some have just started this year.

I am comfortable working with computers, however, I rely on the others on the tech team to help if something comes up. I have served all of the roles except floor camera. I enjoy the robo cam and the producer roles. Setting up and selecting the camera shot is always exciting to me. Sometimes Pastor Tom changes things up to make it even more exciting!
