Small Group Discussion Questions

Getting Started

Take some time to catch up and connect as a group. Pray before discussion. Expect God to move through your time together!

Pacing Your Group

Move quickly through "observation" leaving enough time for "reflection", "discussion", and "surrender."

Scripture Reading

Re-read the scripture passages as needed when you discuss the questions.

Observation: What does this scripture passage say? Take some time to look up and read: Ephesians 5:22

1. Notice each time the word "Christ" is mentioned. What does Christ model for marriages?

Take some time to look up and read: 1 Corinthians 7:12

2. How can spouses experience God without their spouse's partnership?

Take some time to look up and read: 1 Corinthians 7:6

3. What advantages come with singleness?

Reflection and Discussion: What are some first thoughts flowing from the scriptures? Talk together about how the scriptures connect to everyday life.

- 4. Experiencing God in marriage...
 - ...means joining God's work IN my spouse.
 - ...means joining God's work THROUGH my spouse.
 - ...means joining God's work WITH my spouse.
 - ...means experiencing God TOGETHER.
- As you think of these phrases, where are you already experiencing God?
- Where are you anticipating God working in the future?
- Where are you stuck and needing prayer?
- 5. Do you and your spouse take time to regularly talk about God's activity in your family, church, and world? If not, how might you begin to do that?
- 6. How have you and your spouse determined your giving? How have you purposefully been investing in God's kingdom as a couple?

Surrender: Responding to God's voice.

- 7. What is one thing God is saying to you through this study and discussion?
 - ** Take some time to pray for one another in response to what has been discussed today **
