

We are a part of the Evangelical Covenant Church (ECC), a denomination of more than eight hundred churches in the United States and Canada. It was founded by Swedish immigrants in 1885 as a voluntary covenant of churches committed to working together to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Covenant churches emphasize the Bible's witness to new life in Jesus Christ expressed in a day to day walk with the Lord.



For Covenant people, our essential beliefs are summed up in six "Covenant Affirmations."

Mission

Since 1979 Thornapple Covenant Church has been called to help people find and follow

Jesus Christ (John 1:35-51). We believe this to be our main task and by the power of the Holy Spirit we participate in God's mission that all people come to faith and that all things be made right in and through Jesus our Lord.



As an intergenerational Jesus-Centered Community we believe we are called to know Jesus and follow him by centering our lives around him and by doing so experience his transforming presence, a transformation by which we become more like Christ, know his abundance in our lives and willingly live like Christ for the sake of others and the sharing of the good news of the gospel (Romans 12:1-2; Galatians 4:19; 1 Peter 2:21).

But how should we live? What shape does our discipleship take in our daily lives? At Thornapple finding and following Jesus means we humbly commit ourselves to a way of daily living that honors Jesus and winsomely draws people to him. To that end we invite each person to practice the following missional habits.

- Bless our neighbors with God's love and the good news of Jesus (Witness).
- Look to God in prayer at all times and seasons (Pray).
- Learn Jesus through engagement with God's word (Word).
- Share our life with a small group of disciples (Community).
- Care for the poor and vulnerable as we extend the compassion of Christ (Serve).

It is our hope and prayer that as a result of our active faith we will see people find Jesus Christ, follow him with passion and maturity, and work for the flourishing of our city and world.

Our Values

Multigenerational

We are committed to ministry and service to all generations within our congregation.

- Children are welcomed and nurtured in biblical teaching from their time in the nursery through their entry to middle school. Adult and student volunteers minister to our children and those of our community on Sunday mornings, during Vacation Bible School and through our Trailblazers on Wednesday evenings.
- Student Ministry provides outreach activities designed to attract unchurched friends, small group studies and summer mission and adventure trips. Student Ministry staff and volunteers are committed to investing in relationships designed to last throughout a student's entire time in middle school and high school.
- Adults serve within our congregation's ministries and mature as disciples of Jesus Christ through affinity and age-based groups. Seniors can volunteer for VBS one day and attend Soup and Study for Prime Timers the next day.

Evangelism

- We reach parents and children through various activities like VBS, family camps, mission trips, men's and women's retreats, recreational activities and community partnerships.

Responding with humility to help those in need.

We have been blessed with abundance. It is important to us to share our abundance with those in need.

- Whenever there is a specific need in our church or community, our people respond richly (e.g., preparing and delivering freezer meals for shut-ins during COVID).
- Our church body supports several local mission organizations, both financially and with hands-on help. On any given weekend, congregants can be seen volunteering their time to work on mission and outreach projects throughout the community and in their own backyards.
- We generously give our time and financial resources to meet needs within our church and beyond our walls. It is an important part of our worship to be committed to supporting local and global organizations.

Our Values

Small Groups

The caring relationships in small groups are the heart of our church.

- They are places to build friendships, explore faith in Jesus Christ and deepen awareness of God's presence.
- They are places of relational, spiritual and missional growth.
- On average we have 25-30 adult small groups actively doing life together.
- Other groups include Prime Timers for seniors, Horizons for middle age adults, Young Adult group, Student Ministry small groups, Men's Small Groups, Women's Bible Studies, MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers) and Moms on a Mission (moms of school age children).

Investing in Community

Our church is committed to making an impact for Christ in our local and global community,

- The recent completion of our Thornapple Community Center was the culmination of our Always Making Room investment, including a large multipurpose room and commercial kitchen. This addition allows Thornapple to open our building to our local community for outreach events, recreation and banquet activities, as well as hosting members of our community in need, such as Family Promise.
- The Love Mercy Do Justice team facilitates our congregation in serving and investing in local ministries such as Safe Haven Ministries, Dégagé Ministries, In the Image and Family Promise. The church has developed new collaborations with the local YMCA in pre-marital counseling and personal financial management.
- Our congregation supports global ministries through financial and prayer support of 13 individuals, couples and organizations. Our support includes traveling to the overseas homes of our international missionaries to learn about and support their work. In November each year, our congregation participates in the ECC's Covenant World Relief offering; this past year, our donations for CWR exceeded \$29,000.

Post-COVID Reality

What is the lingering impact of a global pandemic?

The church around the world is asking: "What now?" "How do we regather?" "Does a post-pandemic environment offer new opportunities for ministry?" "How do we serve our congregation, our community?" "How do we 'do church'?"

We want to be a church that is well-prepared to welcome people, both in person and virtually.



We value a body that exhibits a rich diversity in individual history, viewpoints and worship preferences. What unifies us is our love for Jesus.

Our over 40-year history has shown this to be a strong value woven through many joys and obstacles. But, over the last four years, we have seen significant struggle in keeping this value alive and well. As the worldwide body of Christ is showing increasing divisiveness, we are seeing that mirrored in our congregation. This is not who we want to be.

We want to be a church that agrees on the main principles of Christianty and does not let the world divide us.

Aging Congregation

As our congregation ages, we have seen falling numbers in younger adult/family attendance.

The largest demographic percentage of our congregation is over 60-years-old but we see an opportunity for growth in serving those 40 and under, particularly young families. In attracting younger people, we don't want to alienate our long-time members, instead we want to engage them and partner with them in reaching out to our community to minister to the children, youth and young adults that are searching for a church body to call home.

We want to minister to all ages and be a vibrant church everyone can call home so we can continue to grow and minister to our greater community.
