If you could choose one color to describe you, what would it be and why?

Choose questions for your small group.

- 1. What stood out to you the most from the message? What's one thing you learned?
- 2. Have you ever compared yourself to someone you think is better than you? Where should we get our identity? God created us. He determines our identity. No one on earth does.
- 3. Read **1 Corinthians 4:3-4 NIV**. Have you ever found yourself overthinking other people's thoughts about you? How can we overcome this and focus more on living in a way that God will judge as good?
- 4. Pay attention to the phrase "I do not even judge myself." We compare ourselves to others so easily. How can we move away from those thoughts? What are some things we can do to view ourselves as valuable?
- 5. Why is it important for us to view ourselves as valuable? How does this change the way we treat others?
- Pray together. Pray that your students would throw away the world's lies and focus on God's identity for them—they are valuable! Pray they realize the Lord's power and promise through Jesus Christ's sacrifice to prove they are important.
