School and the Community

Our high school is located in the city of Palm Springs, California, a resort community of approximately 55,000 year-round residents, with an additional winter resident population of 35-45,000. DCHS opened its doors to the first freshman class in 1999, and celebrated with our first graduating class crossing the stage to receive their diplomas in 2003. Students attending DCHS come from all across the Coachella Valley. While 75% live in the cities of Palm Springs, Cathedral City, and Desert Hot Springs, many travel daily from Yucca Valley, Palm Desert, La Quinta, Indio, and Beaumont.

<u>Admission Policy</u>

Desert Chapel Christian School is open to anyone interested in securing a Christian education, from Kindergarten through twelfth grade, whom the school finds qualified for admission and who agrees (and whose parents agree) that he or she shall abide by Desert Chapel Christian School rules and expectations.
