

DAY 7

When we memorize Scripture, we're able to recall important truths when we need them most. Try memorizing this verse by repeating the words "yesterday, today, and forever" throughout your day.



DAILY DEVOTIONAL



EVEN IF/WEEK 1

DAY 1

The grass withers and the flowers fade, but the word of our God stands forever. Isaiah 40:8 NLT

Take a walk outside and look at the nature around you. Whether it's grass in your front yard, trees on the street, or a plant along the sidewalk, nature is all around us and constantly changing from season to season. Sometimes, this change is noticeable—like when you see leaves change colors during the fall. Other times, it's more gradual-like when an ant hill grows bigger and bigger over several months. Regardless of if the change is fast or slow, there's another thing all nature has in common: It will eventually fade. However, in today's verse we learn that, unlike nature, God's Word to us—His promises—never fade.

This week, as you notice things in nature growing and fading, let it be a reminder that God's Word and promises NEVER fade.

DAY 2

But the Lord's plans stand firm forever: his intentions can never be shaken. Psalm 33:11 NLT

Do you have a friend who's constantly changing plans at the last minute? Or a family member who says one thing and then does something different? It can be incredibly frustrating to depend on people who are unreliable and change on a whim. However, it's comforting to know that God's not like that. The author of this Psalm tells us He is firm, unmovable, and reliable in His plans—forever.

This week, spend some time in prayer, thanking God that you can count on His unchanging ways.


DAY 3

For the things we see now will soon be gone, but the things we cannot see will last forever.

2 Corinthians 4:18b NLT

You've likely heard the phrase, "Seeing is believing." And when all we SEE are the constant changes happening in our lives, it's easy to BELIEVE that's the way things are always going to be. We'll always be on a roller coaster of change at home, at school, in relationships, and on the sports team. By contrast though, the Bible tells us that what we see is fleeting. In fact, God urges us to build our lives around—and focus on—what we CANNOT see: God and God's goodness.

This week, when you go through something difficult, remember that your current season of life is temporary, but God and His love and goodness toward you are permanent.



DAY 4

Your fame will endure to every generation.

Psalm 102:12b NLT

Have you ever heard someone older say, "When I was your age," in reference to how much has changed since they were younger—from cars to TVs to phones. And while times certainly have changed through the generations and will continue to change, this verse reminds us God's name and His fame have not, and will not, change.

This week, talk to your Small
Group Leader about how the world
around them has changed since
they were your age. Then, ask them
to tell you about how God has NOT
changed in that time, too.

DAY 5

God is not a man, so he does not lie. He is not human, so he does not change His mind. Numbers 23:19a NLT

Has a friend ever lied to you? If so, that probably ranks up there as one of the more hurtful or upsetting moments you've experienced. When someone lies to you, much of what you thought about that person usually changes in an instant. Although we can't always trust in the character of the people around us, today's verse reminds us we can always trust in God's unchanging ways. God never lies to us, tricks us, or changes His mind.

The next time you're tempted to bend the truth or change your mind about something, look to God's unchanging character as an example for how you should live. You'll be glad you did!

DAY 6

When you go through deep waters, I will be with you. When you go through rivers of difficulty, you will not drown. When you walk through the fire of oppression, you will not be burned up; the flames will not consume you. Isaiah 43:2 NLT

This past week at my youth group, we talked about the characteristics of God. My pastor asked us to look at a list of traits we had come up with together the week before and find the word that sticks out to us the most. Mine was gentle.
