From Pastor's Pen:

"Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits." (Matt. 21:43)

To the present heirs of God's word and grace:

As we prepare to celebrate another anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation, I have chosen to reference something that Luther wrote which is far from celebratory. In fact, it is a stern warning for all of us who have been blessed by the restoration of the Gospel which was made possible by the confession made and sacrifices offered by previous generations of the faithful. It is Luther's statement regarding the "passing rain."

For the past couple decades many of us have watched in horror as our society has grown to despise its Christian roots, along with biblical principles of morality. We have grown fearful as we witness our world sinking ever more quickly into forms of depravity such as we could not have imagined. We have wrung our hands in angst as fewer from each successive generation retain their faith and the size of our worshipping congregation shrivels. In a recent conference I attended, we were warned that following this nearly two-year reign of COVID terror, it is expected that twenty to thirty percent of those who came to worship prior to COVID will not return, and the remainder will come less frequently and be less active in congregational life! So who exactly is to blame for all of this?

It is us! For many years we have neglected good catechesis - dumbing things down and lowering the bar. We have failed to exercise discipline with our members, allowing them to believe that they can still be "Christians" while despising preaching, the sacrament and God's Word. We have taught our children that most other things in life are far more important than faith, church and God. According to Christ the kingdom of God was given to us but we refused to produce its fruits.

Before you put down this edition of "The Informer" in anger or despair, before you storm my office to throw me in a pit along-side Jeremiah for being such a doomsday prophet, I ask you to read the words of Luther, "Let us remember our former misery, and the darkness in which we dwelt. Germany, I am sure, has never before heard so much of God's word as it is hearing today; certainly we read nothing of it in history. If we let it just slip by without thanks and honor, I fear we shall suffer a still more dreadful darkness and plague. O my beloved Germans, buy while the market is at your door; gather in the harvest while there is sunshine and fair weather; make use of God's grace and word while it is there! For you should know that God's word and grace is like a passing shower of rain which does not return where it has once been. It has been with the Jews, but when it's gone it's gone, and now they have the Turk. Rome and the Latins also had it; but when it's gone it's gone, and now they have the pope. And you

Germans need not think that you will have it forever, for ingratitude and contempt will not make it stay. Therefore, seize it and hold it fast, whoever can; for lazy hands are bound to have a lean year." LW 45:352.

We can, by God's grace and power, return to the LORD. With Luther, we can take our stand upon God's Word and boldly confess Him before the evil forces of our day. We can put God in His rightful place upon the throne of our hearts. We can use His name regularly to offer prayer, praise and thanksgiving. We can honor preaching and His Word through regular worship and Bible Study. We can live holy lives and share the Gospel of Christ and Him crucified for the forgiveness of sins with others to bear fruits for His kingdom. You American Lutherans who have been made heirs of God's word and grace, make use of it! Seize it! Hold it fast and it will certainly not be taken away from you.

Vicar's View

The Devil, Martin Luther, and Inkwells

What do the devil, an inkwell, and Martin Luther all have in common? Now I know this sounds like the setup to some kind of bad joke, but it's not. For one, this year (2021) is the 500th anniversary of Luther being hidden away in the Wartburg Castle. This is where he translated the Bible from the original languages (Greek and Hebrew) into German. This was a first, because the translation was actually readable. Previous translations had been extremely wooden sounding and sometimes just illegible.

It was in this small room that one of the most interesting events of his time in the Wartburg took place. Legend has it that the devil himself appeared to Luther, trying to interrupt his translation work. Luther grew frustrated and hurled his inkwell at the devil's head, and the devil left. Luther here shows us something that we should know about the devil. It's a lesson I taught to my pre-confirmation students recently. The devil might be a formidable adversary, and he is scary. He can quote scripture and twist it for his own purposes. But all of that is not the defining characteristic of the devil.

The truth is, the devil is a loser. He lost the war. Jesus defeated him, and he is now mortally wounded, lying bleeding and confounded under the nail pierced feet of our risen Lord Jesus Christ. He has no power over your soul. Jesus won that battle in his crucifixion and resurrection. In your baptism, you were included in that victory. Always remember that, especially around the time of Halloween, the time of scary costumes and scary movies. He can try his tricks all he likes, but you belong to Christ.



"Do Not Be Deceived"

"Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God." (1 Cor. 6)

All of humanity shares in one common failing: we are thoroughly sinful from conception. This inherited sin expresses itself in a myriad of ways. If left in that sinfulness and sin, we are doomed—we will not inherit the kingdom of God.

But notice Paul's past-tense wording: "And such were some of you." In your Baptism, God called you out of the kingdom of darkness into His marvelous light. Your Sin is overpowered by the righteousness of Christ, now yours. The greatest sin, turned over to Christ in repentance and faith, is forgiven. The greatest sinner—washed, sanctified, and justified in the name of Jesus—inherits the kingdom of God.


Treasurer's report- Norm Antolik. There has been excellent giving through the summer months.




