## I. The New Testament Church Grows:

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, the New Testament Church grew exponentially!

3000 converts (Acts 2:41, 5000 converts (Acts 4:4), Multitudes (Acts 5:14), Great company of Priests (Acts 6:7)

## II. Characteristics of the New Testament Church: [Read Acts 2:41-47]

a. Doctrinal

b. Fellowship

c. Prayer

d. <u>Supernatural</u>

e. Sacrificial Giving

## III. The Persecution of the Church:

- a. <u>Stephen</u> is the first martyr of the church: [Read Acts 7:54-60]
- b. <u>Saul</u> of Tarsus leads a great persecution against the New Testament Church: [Read Acts 8:1-4]
- c. The church is <u>scattered</u>, but not <u>defeated</u>.
- d. Saul's conversion [Read Acts 9:1-6 & 17-19]

#### IV. The Gentiles Receive the Gospel:

- a. Peter visits Cornelius. [Read Acts 10:1-16]
- b. Peter receives the revelation that God's plan for salvation includes the Gentiles. [Read Acts 10:34-35]

## Acts 10:34-35 (NKJV)

**34** Then Peter opened his mouth and said: "In truth I perceive that God shows no partiality.

35 But in every nation whoever fears Him and works righteousness is accepted by Him.

- c. The Gentiles receive the gift of the Holy Spirit and are baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. [Read Acts 10:44-48]
- d. Peter explains to those in Jerusalem that God has received the Gentiles into the church. [Read Acts 11:15-17]

## V. Paul's Missionary Trips:

## Acts 13:1-3 (KJV 1900)

1 Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; as Barnabas, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul.

- **2** As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them.
- **3** And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away.
  - a. Paul First missionary trip (Acts 13-14)
    - 1. Traveling Companions: <u>Barnabas</u> & <u>John Mark</u>
    - 2. Destinations: The regions of Cyprus, Pamphylia, & Galatia
  - b. Second missionary trip (Acts 15:36 Acts 17)
    - 1. Traveling Companion: Silas
    - 2. Destination: Philippi, Thessalonica, Athens, and Corinth
  - c. Third missionary trip (Acts 18:23-21:17) circa AD 53-57
    - 1. Traveling Companion: Luke
    - 2. Destinations: <u>Galatia</u>, Western Asia Minor, Macedonia, and Achaia. The base of operations appears to have been <u>Ephesus</u>.

## Acts 19:10 (NKJV)

**10** And this continued for two years, so that all who dwelt in Asia heard the word of the Lord Jesus, both Jews and Greeks.

- d. Arrest & Imprisonment in Rome (Acts 21:30 28:3)
  - 1. Paul returns to Jerusalem and is arrested.

## Acts 23:11 (NKJV)

11 But the following night the Lord stood by him and said, "Be of good cheer, Paul; for as you have testified for Me in Jerusalem, so you must also bear witness at Rome."

- 2. Paul is a Roman citizen and appealed to Caesar.
- 3. After much travel and hardship, Paul arrived in Rome and lived in a <u>hired</u> <u>house</u> while awaiting an audience with the Emperor.

#### Acts 28:30-31 (NKJV)

- **30** Then Paul dwelt two whole years in his own rented house, and received all who came to him.
- **31** preaching the kingdom of God and teaching the things which concern the Lord Jesus Christ with all confidence, no one forbidding him.
  - e. Letters from Rome: Many of Paul's letters to the church were written while he was in prison, and were considered by the early church to be <u>scripture</u> and would comprise much of our New Testament today.
