When and where is InsideOut?

InsideOut, our environment for High School Students (grades 9-12), happens each Sunday at 4:30 pm in the auditorium.

What does a new student need to do when they arrive?

We're excited to meet them! They can head straight to the auditorium to the Guest Services table where we'll get some of their info. We'll then connect them with their Small Group Leader and the fun can begin. If a new student comes with a friend that's currently attending InsideOut, we'll make sure they're in the same small group if they're in the same grade.

What happens in InsideOut?

It really is the best night of the week, but here's how it goes:

Check in, grab some food, and hang out with your small group: Be sure to check in on the iPad when you come in, grab some food (it's the good stuff, think Cane's, Double Dave's, Bush's Chicken... and all free!) and have some fun catching up with friends in your small group. There's plenty to do before large group gets started; ping pong, Xbox or you can just hang out on some of the comfy spaces we have.

Large Group: When the countdown begins on the stage, find a spot to sit with your small group. We'll get started with a game, sometimes just 1 participant from a small group or sometimes the whole room gets in on the fun. Then get settled to hear a relevant message before you head into small group.

Small Group: Friendships that make an impact in a great way. This time you'll circle up with your small group and leaders and talk about the message and how it relates to you.
