

TUESDAY AFTERNOON

- 1) Read through the scriptures provided using the grid R.E.A.D.
- 2) Focus your prayers on the geographic area that God has placed you—the Bay Area of Houston.
- 3) Pray that the people of the Bay Area of Houston would be glad and sing for joy because they come to know the saving power of God.

TUESDAY EVENING

But, as it is written, “What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him”— these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For who knows a person’s thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God. And we impart this in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual truths to those who are spiritual. The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. The spiritual person judges all things, but is himself to be judged by no one. “For who has understood the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?” But we have the mind of Christ.

- 1) Read through the scriptures provided using the grid R.E.A.D.
- 2) Pray expressing desire and ask to see the Holy Spirit search our hearts, teach us wisdom and impart His words in increasing measure — individually and corporately.

MONDAY MORNING

Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away. Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; for the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

- Psalm 1:1–6 (ESV)

- 1) Read through the scriptures provided using the grid R.E.A.D.
- 2) Write out a short prayer that expresses in your own words your desire to seek God
- 3) Spend some time expressing praise to God for who he is and what he has already done in your life. Cultivate gratitude by listing out the many reasons you can be thankful. Maybe play one or more of your favorite worship songs and practice kneeling or standing with arms raised as you worship the Lord.

MONDAY AFTERNOON

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming. In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old

self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

- Colossians 3:1–11 (ESV)

- 1) Read through the passage provided.
- 2) Begin in prayer by acknowledging the truth about Christ and call to mind “the things that are above.”
- 3) Confess sins that you are aware of or areas where your heart has become set on the things of this world or sinful patterns that you’re

engaging in. Ask the Holy Spirit to bring to light anything that you might not have been aware of.

- 4) Turn this passage into a prayer and pray out in your own words.
- 5) Take a few moments to be quiet before the Lord confidently being receptive of his grace to help.

MONDAY EVENING

Put on then, as God’s chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

- Colossians 3:12–17 (ESV)

- 1) Read through the passage provided.
- 2) Turn this passage into a prayer, praying it out in your own words.
- 3) Ask the Holy Spirit to help you put on the attribute listed in this passage.
