
We will begin the new year with 4 messages focused on this journey,



FAMILY MINISTRIES



To see the beauty all around,




NEW WEBSITE COMING SOON!!- SUBSPLASH PLATFORM

UMW Sunday Project

HOW, Helping Orphans and Widows is the mission to women in Africa begun by Karen Lantz over 10 years ago after a visit to her missionary son. She learned that a woman widowed surrendered her rights to property to her husband's family if he died and she was left widowed, even with children. Karen began a program to supply a goat to the mother to feed her family. She works with a dedicated veterinarian on-site. The recipient is given opportunity to raise goats, and at some point when possible, pass on an offspring to help another widow gain a means of living.

This is a time when her 501c3 non-profit especially needs help. United Methodist Women at FUMC have chosen HOW to receive all monies from "Presence in the Parlor" during UMW Sunday, January 9, 2022, to go for this purpose.

Reflections

"Be still and know that I am God...." (Psalm 46:10a) Interestingly, these words are preceded by references to roaring waters, mountains falling into the sea, desolation, and shields of fire. Be still? How could anyone be still in the midst of such? On our own, we couldn't. If, however, we've settled in both heart and mind that—as the rest of verse 10 tells us—He is God, then we have long since learned that what He says, is. Consequently, what He commands, we do. Why? Because in giving one's life to Him and receiving Christ Jesus as one's Savior, one has signed on to doing things His way.

Do we get it all just right on the first try? Most likely not. But with the Word as our textbook, Holy Spirit as our Professor, and the Lord's hand of protection upon us, we begin to grow up. We learn, as Paul admonished the Philippians (2:5), that our "... attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus." We discover that "I can do everything through Him who gives me strength." (Philippians 4:13)

Something for which we can be utterly grateful is that even if we stumble or don't get things just right, we admit it, and the Lord our God is right there to pick us up, dust us off, and get us back on track. How can He do that? Why would He do that? He's just being Himself. He loves us.

Not only does He love us, God IS love. (See I John 4:16) He is the original Giver of good things. Look what He gave Adam and Eve—dominion over His planet and everything on it. True, they royally blew it. They now needed clothing. He saw to it. Beautifully. And Noah! Talk about God's hand of protection. For faithful Abraham, too. God gave the Blessing to him and to his descendants, among whom would be Jesus' followers. (Not to mention the huge land grant of Genesis 15:18!)

In the Lord our God there is safety. "Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations...from everlasting to everlasting you are God." (See Psalm 90:1-2) "I will say of the Lord, 'He is my refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust.' " (Psalm 91:2) Got troubles? Back to Psalm 46, verse 1: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever present help in trouble." And see here: "The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer: My God is my rock, in whom I take refuge. He is my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold. I call to the Lord, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies." (Psalm 18:2-3) Then: "The name of the Lord is a strong tower, the righteous run to it and are safe." (Proverbs 18:13) Best we handle His name with care.

Isaiah 46:9b-10 reminds us to "Remember the former things, those of long ago; I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me. I make known the end from the beginning, from ancient times, what is still to come. I say: My purpose will stand, and I will do all that I please."

As we step into the New Year of 2022, Lord, we quiet our hearts before you. We ask for safety in whatever lies ahead and for wisdom to know just how you would have us handle our part in it. It is in the name of Jesus we ask these things. We love you, Lord, and we thank you. We love you.
