

God Defeated Jericho | May 22, 2022| Kindergarten - 2nd grade

BIBLE PASSAGE: Joshua 2 & 6

BIG PICTURE QUESTION: What is a miracle? A miracle is something God does that usually cannot be done so that we can know He is all-powerful.

CHRIST CONNECTION: By faith, Rahab believed God would win the battle. When the Israelites attacked Jericho, Rahab and her family received mercy and became part of God's people. Jesus has won against sin and death. Everyone who trusts in Jesus receives mercy and becomes part of God's family forever.

BOTTOM LINE: True courage leads me to treat others like God has treated me.

THE WIN FOR SUNDAY GROUPS: Give kids a first look at The Bible, Jesus and our need for a Savior by embracing their physical needs or engaging their interests. Use The Code when necessary to help redirect kids and build relationships.

BIBLE PASSAGE CONTEXT

In our Bible story today, we see not just mercy, but courageous mercy. Rahab by faith, courageously trusted God and hid the Hebrew spies. Mercy is not courageous until being merciful costs us something. Rahab's mercy was pushed to the testing point.

She had compassion and, in doing so, risked her life. She showed mercy; as a result, she received mercy. Mercy is compassion or forgiveness shown toward someone when it is within one's power to punish or harm that person. Mercy was a key mark of Jesus' ministry. He modeled mercy for us on earth, showing numerous times compassion and forgiveness to those who didn't deserve it.

This is the beauty of Christ that we see in stories like Rahab. When the spies were sent to scout out Jericho, by faith, a woman named Rahab believed God would win the battle so she agreed to help the spies and God was gracious to her and promised to save her from the destruction of the city. The God we serve is lavish in His mercy and rich in His kindness. What Rahab experienced is a glimpse of God's mercy we see in Christ. Jesus is the full expression of the mercy and kindness of God. Jesus isn't concerned from a distance; He took on human flesh and dwelt among us. Jesus didn't just act mercifully when it was convenient. He laid down his life so that we could be forgiven.

Rahab modeled for us what Jesus preached in the Sermon on the Mount: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy" (Matt. 5:7). Let us today be extenders of mercy to others because of the tender mercy of God in Christ we have received because of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ.

TAKEAWAYS

- Throughout the Bible, God displayed His great power by preforming miracles which means He did things that usually cannot be done. God could do them because He is all powerful and can do anything. God defeated Jericho not with an army but with a miracle.
- When the wall fell down flat. The Israelites went into the city and captured it. They kept Rahab and her family safe because she had helped the spies. Rahab modeled for us what Jesus preached in the Sermon on the Mount: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy" (Matt. 5:7).
- Jesus didn't just act mercifully when it was convenient. He laid down his life so that we could be forgiven.

Jericho- One of the oldest cities in the world and known as the "City of palms." It had rich soil, abundant water, and constant sunshine.

SOCIAL ACTIVITY: Choose Your Own Game

What You Need: Socials Book, 3 pool noodles, masking tape, stopwatch/timer, score sheets, plastic cups, candy worms, lifesavers, paper clips, paper, bandaids, sticky tack/gum, scissors, stacks of books, 100 index cards, 50 pennies, ,scotch tape, measuring tape, 3 pool noodle circles, cones, I Spy activity pages, pencils **Objective:** There are 5 activities in your Socials Book, kids will help decide the game of the day.

Winning. The goal is to get everyone in your group to participate in a game.

As kids are coming in, set up the game and ask kids to join you as you play the game. Games are a great way for kids to engage with each other and you as you get to know each other. Use this time to ask them questions about their week and any other important follow up questions to things you have talked about in the past.

What You Say: Ask this question: "Have you ever done something that seemed impossible? Tell me about it. Today, we'll learn about how God did something that seemed impossible. God defeated Jericho by giving the Israelites some very unusual instructions."

APPLICATION ACTIVITY: "I spy" Build

What You Need: Jenga blocks

What You Do:

- Form two teams of kids.
- Select a volunteer from a team to secretly select something in the room.
- He will then say, "I spy with my little eye something _____," filling in the blank with a single descriptor of the object they selected, such as its color, shape, or texture.
- The first person to call out the correct answer will stack a wooden block for her team.
- She will become the new spy and play will continue.
- After two minutes, the team with the tallest wooden wall wins. If time allows, rearrange teams, descontract the walls, and play again.

What You Say "Jericho's walls were big and strong. When they fell, it was clear that God did a miracle. What is a miracle? A miracle is something God does that usually cannot be done so that we can know He is all-powerful. We can be part of a greater miracle. Jesus lived a perfect life, died in our place, and miraculously rose from the dead. Anyone who has faith in Him will be saved and given new life. The Holy Spirit helps us live for God, sharing the gospel so more will be saved."

TRANSITION ACTIVITY: Keep it Quiet, Hold it Out

What You Need: no supplies needed

What You Do:

- Ask kids to stand, find a partner, and face one another.
- Explain that this activity had two parts. First, kids should remain completely silent.
- Partners will take turns making silly faces, trying to make the other person laugh.
- When someone breaks the silence, that person is out.
- The winner should find a new partner and continue.
- After a few moments, begin part two. Both partners will draw a breath at the same time and then sustain a vocal tone for as long as they can.
- The first player to run out of breath must sit down.
- Continue the activity until only one player remains.

What You Say "Was it difficult to hold back laughter when your partner made a silly face? Sometimes it can be hard to stay silent. In today's story, the Israelites marched quietly for six days before they broke the silence with a shout! Let's look at our discussion questions to help us understand more about this story."

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- Will God always give you what you ask Him for?
- Why can we trust God even if He doesn't answer our prayers how we want Him to?
- **Do you think God's battle plan seemed strange to Joshua?** Point out that Joshua saw God's miracles in the wilderness. Joshua knew that God uses impossible circumstances to bring about His purposes. God's plans are perfect. We can trust Him even if we don't understand His plans.
- What did Rahab risk when she chose to save the two spies? Was it worth it? Remind kids that Jericho was Israel's enemy. Rahab may have been considered a traitor to her people if she was found to have helped Israel. Helping Israel came a great risk to not only her life, but to Rahab's family as well. But her faith was rewarded. Not only did Rahab get to join God's chosen people but also the Bible tells us that Rahab played a role in God's plan to save sinners.
- How did Jericho's defeat show God's power and mercy? Emphasize that God defeated Jericho in a way no one else could have. Word spread to the Israelites' enemies that God was mighty. Rahab had faith in God, and He made her a part of His people. God graciously allowed her life to be spared.

TRANSITION TO HOME: Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kid and call them by name.
