How to Study your Bible 1. Observation:

Read it, and identify things you know or notice Example: who wrote it, who is speaking, is this a parable?, etc.

2. Interpretation:

Determine what the passage means. Key questions: what does the author mean? What does this mean in its context? Example: "He must increase, but I must decrease." - John 3:30 – John the Baptist is saying that Jesus is more important than himself.

3. Application: What does the truth in this passage mean for me today?

Example: John 3:30 – I should have the attitude of John the Baptist and think of Jesus as the only important person – not me.
