Each month the Social Ministry highlights a special giving opportunity and volunteer opportunities. January's emphasis is to support 1) First Contact <a href="http://firstcontactinc.org">http://firstcontactinc.org</a> and 2) the Christ Lutheran Mike Steiner

Benevolence Fund.

First Contact is a not-for-profit interdenominational resource and referral ministry, which endeavors in the name of Jesus to assist Porter County residents in need. The vision of FC is to engage a community of givers, through churches, individuals, and organizations to help support those facing hardship. FC has offices in Valparaiso and Portage. When Porter County residents come to the offices of Christ Lutheran with needs as described above, First Contact is our partner in helping address these needs. FC also welcomes volunteers to help staff their office hours.

Mike (Marjorie) Steiner was a member of Christ Lutheran who in her will asked her family to donate her financial savings (about \$15,000) to CLC. She asked that these monies be used to help CLC members who at a particular time have social, physical, and financial needs. The Social Ministry and Mission Committee established policies and procedures for making effective use of these funds to benefit those needing help with rent, utilities, emergency food, medicine, and counseling. Since it has been quite a few years since Mike's gift, and since numerous CLC members have benefited, the fund needs new donations each year.

Help achieve our goal of \$2500 in January (over and above giving combined with CLC's budgeted amount of \$1200). By achieving our goal CLC will help **First Contact** and **Steiner Fund** continue to thrive. ## Medical Mission Trip to GUATEMALA, MARCH 11-20, 2022 We need your help please!

A request from Gail Mannington RN CEN, I am an AMOS Board Member and the Treasurer.

Our team of 12 has been announced and we are planning for our Medical Mission trip to Esquipulas, 6 hours east of Guatemala City. We provide medical clinics, speech pathology services and education to remote mountains villages surrounding Esquipulas and Copan, Honduras where they have limited/no access to medical care.

Since our first trip in March 2017 the opportunities to provide services has exceeded our expectations. Christ Lutheran's congregation has been the Cornerstone support for our trips since our first trip in March 2017 by providing necessary medications, monetary donations, knitting/ crocheting of newborn hats, making of cloth bags for our teenage feminine hygiene education program, providing t-shirts which identify us as a team providing services to their people, supplies for our education program provided to the orphans in the orphanage where we stay – to name a few... and prayers to bless us on our way.

I am humbly asking for your support again. On average, we see and treat about 1000 patients in 5 clinic days and the needs are voluminous. We raise funds to purchase the prescription medications to provide to this population and collect over-the-counter medications to take with us.

Monetary donations can be made to Gail Mannington and below is a list of medications, bold means high volumes needed, underlined means we run out quickly.

The following ointments: Neosporin, Hydrocortisone, Anti-itch cream, triple antibiotic, Diaper Rash, antifungals, muscle rub, Benadryl.

Vitamins: Adult and Children Chewable (NO GUMMIES PLEASE, they melt) Children's Pain and Fever medications, cough syrups, Flu relief. (We run out each time)

**Infant Pain and Fever medications.** (We run out each time)

Benadryl, Tums/Antacid meds, Anti-diarrhea meds, Daytime and Nighttime multi-symptom meds, any

NSAIDS (Ibuprofen, Aleve, Naprosyn, Motrin, Advil, Aspirin) Acetominophen/Tylenol, Pepcid, Zantac, Baby Aspirin, Urinary health meds
