**Social Ministry Emphasis for May.** The Social Ministry special giving opportunity and focus for May is to provide support for a ministry that is international, **CLC's upcoming Summer 2023 Mission Trip to Costa Rica -** in conjunction with Casa Adobe <a href="https://www.facebook.com/casadobe">www.facebook.com/casadobe</a>.

CLC's Mission Trip group has been undertaking projects virtually and locally while planning to travel to Costa Rica next summer (after the Pandemic is finally behind us). Resources are still needed to support several CLC adults and youth and families who will travel. Continuing with the Mission theme of stewardship of the earth, last summer the team partnered locally with Living Green Gardens for a community garden in Gary, with guidance from Casa Adobe in Costa Rica, and with some funding from Thrivent and Von Tobel. This summer the team is focusing on water conservation through a local river monitoring project. VU student/CLC member Lucia Otten traveled to Costa Rica for six weeks at Casa Adobe last summer and shared videos of her experiences fall 2021 at a Faith Formation session.

#### Circle and Fusion Updates

- I encourage everyone reading this to jump for joy! Why? Circle, our high school ministry, hit its highest engagement numbers in five years during April 2022. Engagement numbers track attendance, as well as participation in the life of the church. Whether its sharing meals at Circle, playing games together, or learning how to navigate life transitions – our high schoolers are building a thriving community of support for one another.
  - ⇒ Our high schoolers have been regularly involved in worship and helping with Sunday
  - ⇒ On Easter Sunday, nearly a dozen high schoolers helped hide eggs for the Easter Egg Hunt and assisted with the Easter Bake Sale.
- Fusion has been meeting regularly on Sunday mornings. We just wrapped up a unit on parables that led into Holy Week. On 4/24, Fusion kids assisted with a confirmation service project organized by Elizabeth Kosek and her mentor, Erin Schmidgall.

#### Confirmation Report

- Our 8<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmation class is currently working on learning the Apostle's Creed!
- Our 7<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmation class has begun meeting with mentors!

#### Fundraising Update

Our annual Easter Bake Sale raised over \$900.00 for the youth ministry's special programming. We are blessed by the congregation's support and generosity. A huge thank you to everyone who helped with the bake sale, especially our young people! The money raised will cover the majority of financial scholarships for Confirmation Camp this year!

#### Summer Trip Updates

- We have 15 middle schoolers registered for Confirmation Camp in June at Camp Lutherwald! It's a great group of kids, mostly comprised of 7<sup>th</sup> graders. We are excited for another amazing, life-changing week of camp!
- We have 2 high schoolers registered for Servant Leader Camp in June at Camp Lutherwald. We have a few more kids considering the trip. The camp's curriculum, 'Boundless', is curriculum that was intended to be used at the cancelled National Youth Gathering.

#### National Youth Gathering 2024

- The 2024 National Youth Gathering will be July 16-20, 2024 in New Orleans, LA. Mass Gatherings will be held in the Superdome.
  - ⇒ Tentatively, we anticipate an 8-day trip, over July 12-22. Rough estimate for our budget will be \$40,000.00!

Beloved in Christ,

The first months of our new year gave us a chance to hear, appreciate and discover stories of just how much Christ Lutheran Church changes lives.

We heard from members and friends about the impact our Alcoholics Anonymous group has on those who join them; we heard what a difference it makes to know Christ Lutheran cares; we discovered again the breadth of ministries of music we enjoy and the impact of being invited. Our **Live Bold** project invited us to discover, and remember, and celebrate remarkable ways God works through us and our ministries: This really is a church where lives get changed!

Because of you, your prayers and your excitement for what God is up to, we are delighted, overwhelmed, overjoyed and so proud to report that:

- We have received 122 Statements of Intent, for a 59% response rate of active giving households in our congregation.
- 80% of Statements received indicated an increase in expected giving, 12% a decrease, 2% no change.
- Based on these responses, we project a weekly increase of \$1,938.25.

As this is the highest participation rate we have ever had, and with such a remarkable participation and commitment to sustaining our ministry excellence, we can't help but echo the psalmists: "Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good, God's mercy endures forever!"

Thank you to you and for all the ways you support, sustain, and most importantly participate in Jesus' ministry in your life and through our congregation. Thank you for your faithfulness and for all the lives we are able to touch because of you. Thank you for your generosity; you are making a real difference in the lives of our sisters and brothers and in people we will never get to meet. Thank you!
