While the centre is closed, we remain hard at work to keep abreast of all developments and how they may affect our daily operations.

Please be advised that while some daycare centres may be charging tuition and/or parental contributions during the closure, Kiddies Kollege is not. This is solely our decision, and we have conveyed this decision to our support team with the Region.

Here's how Kiddies Kollege is handling tuition payments/parental contributions and how this will affect you ...

IF YOUR REGULAR CHILD CARE PAYMENT FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH WAS ALREADY PROCESSED

You will be receiving a credit for March 16-31 to be applied against future childcare expenses. Postdated cheques presently on file at Kiddies Kollege, including those for March 15/20 will be held until the closure situation is resolved.

IF YOU CURRENTLY HAVE AN OUTSTANDING BALANCE ON YOUR ACCOUNT, WHICH WILL NOT BE ELIMINATED WITH THE CREDIT DESCRIBED ABOVE

Outstanding payments are still required to be made during the closure. Please call me if you have questions, or to arrange to come in with your payment.

IF YOU ARE RECEIVING CHILDCARE FEE SUBSIDY THROUGH THE REGION

The Region of Peel's Early Years and Child Services department emailed you a Child Care Fee Subsidy Update earlier this week (a copy is attached). Please read through it carefully, as it outlines (among other things) how this situation will affect your "absence" days, reporting requirements and how to obtain assistance from your Children's Services worker.

This situation continues to evolve as new information is received. We'll do our best to stay in touch with you as new developments arise. Our concern is the safety and wellbeing of all our students, their families and our staff. Keeping this in mind, here is some "old" news: none of this is a surprise to God.
