To be a Christian means you have been given new life in Christ. To be lost or unsaved means that you are dead spiritually and infected in all areas by the depravity of sin.


1. What do we learn in 2 Corinthians 5:17 about those that are Christians, those that are now "in Christ"?


2. What does Ephesians 2:1-3 teach us about those apart from Christ?

7. Pray for one another to walk in the Spirit and manifest this new life daily.


SESSION 2 FIRST THINGS FIRST

	If you are like me, you are constantly asking the question, "what's the most important thing for me to focus on right now?" That's a powerful question to apply to all of life. Thankfully, Jesus answered this question in Matthew 22:34-40.


Session 3 HOW TO GROW IN CHRIST

Session 4 GATHERED WORSHIP, BAPTISM, AND COMMUNION

1. What does the Bible tell us about gathering regularly with other members of the body of Christ (Hebrews 10:24-25)?
What weekly gatherings does your church offer? What weekly gatherings do you consistently participate in?
2. What were the regular commitments of the new believers in the book of Acts (See Acts 2:41-47)?
Why do you think they were so actively committed to gathering weekly, even daily?
3. All those who were saved during Peter's sermon in Acts 2 were immediately baptized (see Acts 2:41). Have you confessed your faith in Christ through baptism yet? Explain
4. Baptism represents our death, burial, and resurrection with Christ! What does Romans 6:4 teach us about the power of our baptism into Christ?


John Calvin said that what makes the church the church is that we preach the Word of God in gathered

communities, and that we administer the two sacraments of baptism and communion.

5. If baptism is the one-time initiation into the church where we publicly confess that we are saved, then communion (the Lord's supper) is the ongoing partaking of Christ in order to be sustained and nourished in Him.
Jesus celebrated communion (Passover became communion) with His disciples during His last night on earth before His Crucifixion (read Matthew 26:26-28)
Some of the great saints of God in church history would take communion every day—trading God's life for their life. What is the significance of the Lord's supper to you?
6. What does Paul teach us to do each time we take the Lord's Supper (See 1 Corinthians 11:23-32)?
7. Before you end your session, set up a time to be baptized (if you've never been baptized) and take communion together. Remember Christ, confess your sins, receive forgiveness and be filled with the Holy Spirit!

Session 5 IN CHRIST

Paul uses the phrase IN CHRIST almost 100 times in his 13 New Testament letters. Being IN CHRIST means you are born again, imparted the life of Christ, and that you are forever joined to him.
1. Read the story of Jesus and Nicodemus in John 3:1-14. What does it mean to be born again?
What has changed in your life since you were born again?
2. What are come of the amazing results for those who are horn again? (See 1 Deter 1.2.7)
2. What are some of the amazing results for those who are born again? (See 1 Peter 1:3-7)
Which part of this inheritance encourages you most right now? Why?
3. Jesus gave us new life in Christ. What are the differences between your old life and your new life in Christ? How are we now to live in light of this new life in Christ? (See Romans 6:5-11)
4. We have been given new life because of what Christ has done for us. In what ways are we identified with Christ?

3. How do we rectify the call to love God first and others second, with the call to love ourselves (See Matthew 22:34-40).

1. Many years ago our church went on a several days fast together. When it was over, the overarching thing God spoke to me was this: Northwest Fellowship is about PRAYER and EVANGELISM! God will build our church as we give ourselves to Prayer and Evangelism!
Which is most challenging to you, prayer or evangelism? Explain.
2. Why do you think Jesus cleansed the temple (see Mark 11:15-19)?
You find out what's most important to someone by what makes them the angriest. Why was Jesus so angry? What make you most angry?
3. Each of the four gospels shows Jesus cleansing the temple and three of them have this specific phrase: "My house shall be called a house of prayer"
What does Jesus mean when He calls His church a house of prayer (Read Mark 11:17)? Explain

4. Please write below how each person or group could function as a house of prayer today:

*Your house or family
*Your neighborhood
*Your local congregation
*You community or city
5. Jesus continued this phrase in Mark 11:17 by calling His people "a house of prayer for all nations."
*You and I are called to be a church family where <i>all nations</i> come together in Christ to be a house of prayer. Ask Jesus now to use you and our church more powerfully in this way.
*You and I are called to go out and reach the nations (all peoples). People from many "nations" are living in our city, often right next door to us. Pray now that you, and we as a church, can be more passionate and disciplined to reach our lost neighbors for Christ.
6. Jesus finished this power statement by saying "My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations'? But you have made it a den of robbers." (Mark 11:17)
