Our New Church Directory is Online! View our church directory online or via the mobile app today.

Our all new, up-to-date electronic church directory is now available! **Instant Church Directory** - the program we use to build our church directory - has a member website and mobile device app.

To view our directory online, go to **members.InstantChurchDirectory.com** and follow the prompts under "Sign In" to "Create a login now." Use your email address you have on file at West Lawn. For security reasons, you must confirm your email before you can sign in.

There is also a free mobile app available for download at the Apple® App store, Google Play<sup>TM</sup> store and the Amazon Fire App Store. Simply search for "Instant Church Directory" to get the download.

You will be asked to enter your email address that is on file at West Lawn UMC. If your current email address is not on file with the church, let Kelly Rismiller know so that it can be added. Once you enter your email, follow the directions on-screen to complete the "create a log-in now" process. Because we are using a two-step verification system for security purposes, you will need to check your email before being granted directory access.

After you are signed up, you'll see the most current directory for our church. Any time updates are made, they will show in the directory. If you are using the mobile app, you will be able to search for families and members, and call, email and text right from the app.

Once logged in, you can edit what information is made public to the West Lawn congregation. Currently addresses, phone numbers, email addresses and month/day birthdays are all published.

You can also upload a family or individual photo to your profile. Please consider completing this step so that everyone at West Lawn UMC can put a name to a face!

Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Colossians 3:15, 17

I read a book once that described the maturing of the United States in the post World War II era. The author wrote fondly of the sense of community and purpose that the war had instilled in the American people. It was necessary during the war for everyone to work together and sacrifice common luxuries like gasoline, sugar and rubber. When husbands and sons left home for war, wives and mothers left home for the factories that fed the military machines in Europe and the Pacific. Everyone participated in one way or another for the good of the common cause.

Since the war ended however, that sense of community has changed greatly. It's been said that following the war America was a "front porch society." The front porch was the arena for discussion and relationship building. People would sit on the front porch in a way that invited others to drop by and do the same; issues of the day would be discussed, family time would be shared. The interchange was inevitable because the front porch faced the whole community with no barriers and easy access.

As time passed however, America became a "rear deck society." Barbecues and swimming pools became popular additions to backyards and the social exchange was then limited to neighbors whose yards were connected. The community became smaller by virtue of the fewer numbers of relationships in a person's life. The neighborhood was closing itself off from those who passed by the "front porch."

The trend didn't stop there. As the electronic age gathered steam the family den grew in size and the "rear deck people" moved inside to become a "great room society." The entertainment was no longer eating hotdogs around a redwood picnic table. News and views and interaction with the world was fed to America through TV screens. This move indoors had effectively cut-off the family from the neighborhood in which it lived. Interaction with others in the community now had to occur via invitation, just "dropping by" was not acceptable anymore.

The American sense of community has eroded since the 1940's and the process is still alive as we now look solitarily into computer screens that link us to our world and community via email and the internet. Many of our relationships now commonly exist at a distance. In fact it is now entirely possible to get an education, work a forty-hour week, buy groceries at a virtual supermarket, attend worship and chat with friends without ever stepping away from your keyboard to encounter another human being.

We shouldn't be surprised to find that the forces at play in our world hinder the development of the vital relationships that exist in true community. The apostle Paul so often urges us to live as "members of one body" gratefully teaching and singing and sharing together. The body Paul speaks of is the church. Paul's example of community opposes that of our world and calls us into relationship with each other and with Christ.

Picture for a moment our society without the presence of the church. A foundational force that creates and nurtures global and local community would be missing. From the billions of dollars spent on missions down to the daily support and friendship of fellow members of the body sharing their lives together, there would be no substitute. In fact, I believe that no church translates to no community.

As the summer winds down let's ask ourselves how we can offer a "front porch" to our community with no barriers, easy access and participate in true community as the Apostle Paul calls us to live together in peace as one body.



They worshiped to Rend Collective, learned from Pastors and speakers from across the world, and spent every afternoon in the ocean! Divorce is not a word or action we like to speak or hear about, but it happens in life. Healing from divorce is not easy. At DivorceCare groups, people going through separation and divorce find tools, teachings, and support to help them deal with pain and provide hope for the future.

WLUMC hosts a DivorceCare group. The group meets weekly for 13 weeks to help someone facing these challenges and move toward rebuilding their life. The 13-week program is Christ-based

and includes three main parts to each weekly session: video, discussion, and personal Bible Study. The videos feature information from over 50 leading Christian counselors, teachers, and pastors who specialize in separation or divorce. The videos also include real-life stories of people who have been through all different situations with marital breakups, and they share their pain, challenges, and paths to healing. During the discussion time, the group will discuss the concepts presented in the videos and share what is going on in everyone's life.


Each participant will receive a workbook that contains a daily Bible Study for personal reflection and application throughout the 13-week program and beyond. The DivorceCare sessions also address divorce-related concerns, such as: How long is this pain going to last? Will I survive? Are these feelings I am having normal? Where is God in all this? You will gain insight on how to handle tough situations, and emotions such as anger, depression, and loneliness. Some of the other topics included are finances, Biblical references, relationships old and new, children and even reconciliation.

#### **Hope Rescue Mission Expansion**

Since 1894, Hope Rescue Mission has been a place of refuge for the homeless men of Berks County, Pennsylvania, as they work their way through to transition back into the community as productive and independent individuals. Now, for the first time in our history, the Mission is expanding some services to the larger community. With the July 7th ribbon-cutting ceremony, the LightHouse Women & Children's Center will officially open its doors to welcome guests and others seeking shelter.

LightHouse brings resources to homeless women and children. We transformed our 25,000-square-foot thrift store into 43 residential rooms with private restroom facilities to provide homeless women and children with food, shelter and access to essential services and support programs. We furnished the rooms to be places our guests can call home while on their journey to becoming productive and independent members of the community.

Because most shelters split families, including mothers and sons, across different locations for care, the addition of LightHouse to the Mission means families can remain on the same premises. My deepest thanks go to the donors, sponsors, staff, volunteers and friends of Hope Rescue Mission for turning the dream of LightHouse Women & Children's Center into a reality for the community.


