Dear West Lawn Family,

If you have ever visited San Francisco you have probably looked across the bay and seen that famous prison, Alcatraz, sitting on a rock in the middle of the water. When you tour Alcatraz the guide talks as he takes tourists past barred windows down concrete hallways to a cell used for solitary confinement. After the group enters the cell, standing shoulder to shoulder, the guide closes the door to the cell and all light is gone.

What seems like minutes in the dark is actually just a few seconds. Everyone waits expectantly, quietly, surprised by the absence of light.

When the door finally opens, the light pours in, and people smile. Then for the first time on the tour people actually look at each other. Nervous laughter masks the relief to be back in the light. It's amazing how solitary that confinement can be, even with other people standing right next to you. The light makes all the difference in the world.

If you want to see what Jesus means in your life, just imagine a time without him. Have you ever had that time in your life? A time before Jesus existed for you? A time before you knew about the light of the world? Was it as dark as Alcatraz style solitary confinement, even though there were other people around?

Imagine a time before Jesus was born. Where was the hope for the world? Where was the joy? Where was the focus on love and forgiveness? There really was a time before Jesus, a time when the world was waiting, expecting, and hoping.

Each year during Advent we wait and expect and hope for the coming of Jesus while much of the world around us remains in the dark. For many, the Christmas holiday means shopping and decorating without a hint of the baby Jesus.

As Christians, the center of our holiday season is the light of the world, an infant King, bringing peace. Take a moment and consider: What are the ways you will choose to focus on Jesus this season? How will you grow in your knowledge of him? How will you show those around you the difference he has made to you and to the world? Why not invite others to be part of your Christmas and help them grow as well? Have a joy-filled Christmas season.

# Personal Discipleship: Let Jesus Be Your Guide

Discipleship. Though the word shows up a lot in church settings, knowing exactly what it means and, perhaps more importantly, what it looks like for our personal faith, may be harder to define. The United Methodist Church's mission statement extols us to "make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." The outward-facing disciple-making is one thing; becoming a disciple is another.

For many, personal discipleship may include digging in to a rigorous routine of Bible study, praying fervently and attending church often. Jesus modeled a different path. Defining 'discipleship' without the word 'disciple' "Personal discipleship is about more than Christian ed and attending Sunday school," says the Rev. Stacey Harwell-Dye, pastor of Mercy and Justice at West End United Methodist Church. "The concept of being a disciple is following and patterning. It's almost like an apprenticeship, the act of following Jesus."

Not surprisingly, Jesus showed us how to be a disciple through his day-to-day activities of mingling with and advocating for marginalized communities, extending kindness to others and looking at the world through a lens of love. The scriptural accounts of Jesus being outside the church walls far outnumber those verses where Jesus is inside. Scripture continually tells us to be out in the community doing God's work, Jesus, in the Gospel of Mark, is out feeding, healing, teaching.

A personal journey of discipleship is less about a checklist of what to do and what not to do and more of an abiding in Christ and an abiding in the Spirit. Ask yourself these questions to assess the state of your relationship with God:

What did I do right today?

Where are the areas where I could do better?

Where did I not love my neighbor, not love God, not love myself?

Where did I do well loving God?

Where did I do well loving my neighbor?


Where did I go to those places where Jesus would go?

Join us on Thursday, December 21, at 7:00 pm in the sanctuary for a time of special music, scripture, silent reflection, healing prayer, and communion.





We had a good volunteer turn out of 38 people last month and we thank all who helped. We had a total registered 115 families, but 107 came totaling 386 for October. Note there is always an increase in the number of families in need for November and December pantries.

Please consider volunteering some time if you are available the week December 14<sup>th</sup> for set -up (12:30 to 2:30) and December 15<sup>th</sup> for giving food out to our neighbors in need from 2:30 to 5. We can use ANY TIME YOU CAN GIVE!

The pantry needs donations of nonperishable food items. The pantry especially needs donations of:

- 1. Canned fruits
- 2. Canned vegetables
- 3. Pasta sauce or tomato sauce
- 4. Spaghetti
- 5. Canned meats especially canned tuna, spam, or chicken
- 6. Peanut butter

Bags will be made up on Thursdays because no boxes are coming, so extra help is needed to do this. Bags are made up from food donations from the six churches that support our pantry, so if people could bring two or three cans on a Sunday morning each week to share with their neighbors, it would be tremendously helpful. 


