I was onsite for about five minutes and remember thinking to myself, "I drove seven hours for this?!"

It was Monday morning, July 10, 2023, and I was standing at the rear of a single-family ranch home in Guyan Valley, West Virginia. I, along with a gaggle of youth and a handful of adults were here to serve a family in need as assigned by the Appalachia Service Project. At this site, half of our team was going to repair siding, while the other half – my half – of the team was tasked with installing a French drain system.

This home literally butted up against a steep mountainside. The water runoff from this 70-ish degree slope would flow down the mountain and wash out the dirt along the home's foundation. Additionally, water would pool behind the home, and left it a soggy, mucky, stinky mess.

I walked the length of the house, traversing the swampy water, almost reaching the other end when my foot sunk into slimy mud, up and over my boot. As I pulled my foot upwards and heard the sucking noise of the mud, I could feel my blood pressure rise. I packed all of my carpentry tools – I even bought a new tool belt with suspenders – along with years of amateur experience, and none of it would be used on this trip. "I drove seven hours for this?!"

Fast forward five days from that moment and I couldn't have been in a more opposite mental state than I was on Monday. The six middle school boys, along with a couple of high school girls that would occasionally break away from their siding duties, installed a one-hundred-foot-long French drain that would make Henry Flagg French proud (American inventor of French drain in 1859).

Pickaxes, garden hoes, shovels, and wheel barrels, along with a lot of tenacity, were the tools that we utilized that week (the boys did most of the "back-breaking" work, I was a good supervisor). The French drain worked so well that within a week the back of the home was completely dry and safe to walk. In fact, it was so dry that another volunteer group was able to build a very small deck – something that the homeowner never dreamt was possible.

During the course of the week, the boys underwent a lot of personal transformation... and so did I. It was either Tuesday or Wednesday when I thought about Jesus washing the disciples' feet (John 13). If Jesus, the Son of God, the Savior of all creation, could wash the dirty, grimy, smelly feet of the disciples, I could dig a trench. I, much like the disciples were that night in the Upper Room, was humbled.

That Monday morning, I sinned as my pride got the best of me. I thought I'd get to use my fancy power tools, put my carpentry skills and knowledge to good use; instead, it was a simple spade shovel with a splintered, wooden shaft, that became my companion for the week, and, more importantly, an implement of humility.

It's been my experience that serving others has the ability to humble us, to ground us in reality, and to remind us of the blessings which have been given to us – which are some of the reasons why I believe serving is paramount to our faith. Our church offers a plethora of opportunities to serve locally, domestically, and internationally. Whether it be on campus for West Lawn Wednesday, or going to Reading to serve at a shelter, or drive to Appalachia to repair homes, or fly thousands of miles to El Salvador to build homes, every opportunity to serve will humble us, so long as we allow space for God to transform us.

When I think back to our mission trip in July, I no longer think of it as a question expressed in aggravation, but rather as a statement of my faith... "I traveled seven hours for that."



#### **Organ Special Maintenance Fund**







Journey to Amphipolis, Philippi, Neapoli (Kavala), Thessaloniki, Veria (Berea), Meteora, Delphi, Corinth, and much more. The rate includes airfare, firstclass hotels, guided tours, entrance and program fees, gratuities, daily breakfast and dinner, overseas transfers, and deluxe motor coach. Family and friends are welcome to join us for the trip.

Curious about the itinerary? Here's day 3: Follow in the footsteps of Paul and Silas to Amphipolis and explore the ruins of the many Christian basilicas there. In Philippi is a baptismal site commemorating where God opened the heart of Lydia (a seller of purple from Thyatira) to hear the words of Paul (Acts 16:13 -15). Lydia and her household were the first Christian converts baptized on European soil. View the Roman-era crypt thought to have served as a prison for the Apostle Paul, and explore Philippi's famous Acropolis, marketplace, the Basilica of Paul, and theater. Today's last stop is Neapolis (Kavala), one of Greece's most picturesque mainland ports, where Paul landed with his disciples, Timothy and Silas. See the Roman aqueduct and acropolis before returning to Thessaloniki for dinner and overnight.

12th Night Festival: A celebration of the Nativity January 13, 2024 11:30 AM - 4:00 PM

We invite you to join us as we celebrate Epiphany by attending the 12th Night Festival, hosted by Christ Lutheran Church, in Allentown.

A 40 year-old community tradition held annually around the 12th day after Christmas, the Twelfth Night Festival is a celebration of the Nativity. Traditionally there are twelve days of Christmas. Twelfth Night is the "door" between Christmas and Epiphany (January 6th), the Christian feast celebrating the arrival of the Wise Men. Coming from distant lands, the Wise Men exemplified the showing forth of the newborn King, the recognition that the Christ is for all peoples.

Modeled on medieval pageants and feasts, the production includes hundreds of volunteer cast members from the congregation and the community, both in costume and behind the scenes. The Christ Church choir is accompanied by more than two dozen volunteer singers from other congregations and by a professional chamber orchestra. Local performers including the William Allen High School Dancers and the City of Bethlehem Bagpipe Band are part of the production.

Tickets cost \$10 per person. If you require transportation, West Lawn can take up to 25 guests from our parking lot using our bus and van. Others can carpool. Meet at West Lawn UMC at 11:30 AM on January 13 to carpool together. The show begins at 1:00 PM.
