INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP, MS-203-M

Ministerial Studies [3 credits] Independent Study, Summer 2017 Christian Life College-Madison

I. INSTRUCTORS

II. SCHEDULE

This is an independent study course and as such it will have no formal schedule attached to it. However, students are encouraged to develop their own study schedule to help insure the greatest possible benefit from the course. Although students may complete their assignments at any time, all assignments related to this course must be completed by August 31, 2017. There can be no exceptions.

III. DESCIPTION

This course is designed to move students into deeper levels of understanding regarding the significant concepts and theories that shape our contemporary understanding of leadership development and function in a Christian context. From this primary context, students will be guided into discoveries of personal individual styles, strengths, and opportunities for growth in an effort to enhance personal leadership competencies. This course will also have a deliberate focus on the development of personal character, the deeper life in Christ, and Christ-like servant leadership.

IV. OBJECTIVES

- A. To increase students spiritual influence to the honor of God.
- B. To obtain an understanding of how to grow in spirituality, character and integrity
- C. To be able to articulate and practice the basic disciplines for personal Christian leadership development.
- D. To be able to determine and execute the most effective steps toward proficiency in Christian leadership.
- E. To be able to identify effective means for the development of emerging leaders.
- F. To gain new insights for becoming a mentor and spiritual guide to others.

VI. REQUIREMENTS

- A. Reading Each of the required texts must be read carefully and completely in the order listed above (e.g. *Spiritual Leadership* first, then *The Making of a Leader*, etc.). Students will be required to report on the quantity and quality of their reading.
- B. Chapter Assignments Each student will be required to complete chapter assignments (i.e. a series of questions) for each of the chapters in each of the five textbooks. Each assignment must not only adequately answer the stated question, but must also reflect a good understanding of the related chapter. All assignments must be double spaced and completed in 12 point, Times New Roman font. Please include the assignment question in your response. These assignments can be obtained from the lead instructor at the email address above.
- C. Lecture and Notes Students will be required to take notes on each of the lectures. These notes should only include the lecturer's main points, sub-points and sub-sub-points. There is no need for any greater detail. All assignments must be double spaced and completed in 12 point, Times New Roman font. A library copy of these lectures can be obtained by contacting the lead instructor at the email address above.
