FIRST TIME GUESTS

IT'S MY CHILD'S FIRST TIME ATTENDING. **HOW WILL THEY KNOW WHERE TO GO/WHAT TO DO?**

Family discipleship is having intentional and organic moments that teach your child how to be a follower of Jesus and make Him known. It is one of the most meaningful things parents can do with their lives. It's not about adding one more thing to your to-do list as a parent, it is THE THING. It's about reshaping your current family rhythms and everyday moments to include gospel-centered conversations and practices.

WILL MY CHILD FEEL SAFE?

We know that nothing is as important as the safety and security of every child. God has entrusted us with caring for your children and we are humbled by this privilege. Here are some of the things we do to keep your kids safe and secure.

- All children must be registered the first time they visit.
- Every child and parent will receive a security tag with a security code. If you've already registered, this is computer generated upon check-in. These tags must be matched when you come to pick up your child. If you lose a tag, we will ask for your driver's license before issuing a duplicate security badge.
- During service, all area doors are locked and only those with a security tag or accompanied by a team member are allowed to enter.
- UHBC has trained security officers on campus who patrol the campus on Sunday mornings.
- Every staff member and volunteer has been screened by an outside investigation agency and passed a criminal background check.

HOW DOES CHECK-IN WORK?

First time attenders will register at the welcome desk inside the Preschool and Children's building. As you pull into the parking lot, look for the Kid's Check-In banner posted on the building. You'll enter the doors under the covered drive. Once you are registered in the system, the next time you attend you may check in your child at any available check-in

station throughout the building. After typing in your cell number and selecting your child's name, you and your child will be given matching identification tags that are exclusive to your family and your visit. Your child will need to wear the nametag portion while you keep the matching tag. An identical nametag sticker will be given to your child's teacher at the classroom door. After the service, you will return to your child's room and show your tag in order for your child to be released back to you.

CAN MY CHILD ATTEND WITH A FRIEND/FAMILY MEMBER WHO IS IN A DIFFERENT AGE GROUP?

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WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CHILD CONTINUES TO CRY AFTER DROP-OFF?

Separation anxiety is normal at this age and should not be a cause for concern. Most children settle in quickly and come to love their time here. Please drop your child off and leave quickly after reminding your child that you will be back soon. Once a parent leaves, children tend to respond to the teacher's efforts at welcoming and engaging them. Our staff and volunteers are trained to help your child overcome their anxieties as quickly as possible. You will receive a text if your child does not calm down within a few minutes. We also welcome you to text or stop by the welcome desk to check on your child.

ARE THERE ANY TOOLS PROVIDED TO HELP PARENTS CONNECT WITH WHAT THEIR CHILD IS LEARNING AT CHURCH?

Our goal is for families to take the biblical principles taught on the weekend at church and apply them in your everyday life at home.
