



DIRECTOR OF CONTEMPORARY WORSHIP MINISTRIES

**Part-time salaried position
Exempt Status**

Overview

The Director of Contemporary Worship Ministries is an individual who has a genuine relationship with Jesus Christ, a love for worshipping God through music and the ability to lead others in worship. This person has the musical skills, leadership ability and creativity to lead the congregation in meaningful worship of God. This person creates a cohesive worship team through mentoring and developing the musicians and supervising the media and technical personnel.

Reporting Relationship

The Director of Contemporary Worship Ministries reports to the Lead Pastor.

Major Duties and Responsibilities

The Director of Contemporary Worship Ministries will have the following major duties and responsibilities:

- Oversee all aspects of contemporary worship, apart from preaching/teaching, in coordination with the Lead Pastor and worship team.
- Plan, coordinate, and organize all contemporary worship services. This includes selecting songs, videos and/or artistic elements, communicating with team members, and leading rehearsal.
- Lead the contemporary worship team, both volunteers and staff, who are involved in music and media. This includes recruiting and developing new team members.
- Perform as necessary as worship leader, and be a consistent pastoral presence in the worship services.
- Develop the annual budget for contemporary worship, in conjunction with the Lead Pastor, personnel team, and Session of elders.
- Models heartfelt worship that draws people in, encourages participation and leads people in worship.

Qualifications

The Director of Contemporary Worship Ministries must demonstrate:

- An authentic love of Jesus, a heart that seeks God's guidance, and a commitment to follow him.
- Passion to worship the living God, along with the creativity to craft transformational worship experiences.
- Musical training and ability. This must include singing, and preferably includes playing guitar or keyboard. Also must have the ability to lead singers and instrumentalists.
- Strong interpersonal and leadership skills to lead the worship team, since teamwork is a vital component of a vibrant ministry.
- Organizational ability to plan, organize, and manage multiple tasks. Able to complete tasks both independently as well as with other staff and volunteers.
- Ability to work effectively with the Pastoral and support staff.
- Full support of the mission and ministry of the church. This includes willingness to abide by the Essential Tenets of ECO: a Covenant Order of Presbyterians (our denomination).
- Has the physical abilities to perform the job.
