

Sermon Notes

"The Gospel According to Paul: 'Live & Speak Faithfully for the Lord'" (2 Timothy 1:6-18)

INTRODUCTION

Our 2021 Bible study is *The Gospel According to Paul*, from Acts 8-28 and Paul's letters: Romans, 1 & 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 & 2 Thessalonians, 1 & 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon, and maybe Hebrews. Today's Bible study surfaces how Paul told young Timothy to Live and Speak Faithfully for the Lord:

I. Consider your	(v. 6-7)
II. Accept your	(v. 8a)
III. Remember your	(v. 8b-10)
IV. Realize your	(v. 11-12a)
V. Trust	_ as your (v. 12b
VI. Guard	(v. 13-14)
VII. Choose your	(v. 15-18)

CONCLUSION

Some believers try to go to Heaven alone, in solitude. But believers are never compared to bears or lions, or to other animals that wander alone. Those who belong to Christ are sheep in this respect, that they love to go together. Sheep go in flocks, and so do God's people (Charles Spurgeon). Applying Today's Sermon to Your Life

- 1. Our 2021 Bible study is *The Gospel According to Paul*, from the life and letters of the Apostle Paul in the New Testament. Paul's story starts in Acts 7:57-58, when, known as Saul, Paul is sponsoring the stoning of the evangelist, Stephen. Everything changed when Paul met Jesus in Acts 9! Have you, personally, met Jesus? If so, what has changed?
- 2. Read 2 Timothy 1:6-18. This is the Apostle Paul's second letter to young Timothy. How would you describe Paul and Timothy's relationship?
- 3. Answer the following as True or False:

- 6. Paul counseled Timothy to live in close fellowship with other believers through the church. Why is this necessary to honor Bible teaching? How are you doing so now?
- 7. Church life was never easy for Paul or Timothy. Was it because their faith was weak? What did Paul and Timothy do anyway? What's the lesson for here?
- 8. Imagine living today without faith, without knowing Jesus, without knowing how to pray, and without a supportive church family. Now think about your neighbors, your coworkers, your relatives, your classmates, your friends, and people in your circle of acquaintance. Who needs your faith, your Jesus, your prayers, your church family? Will you pray, reach out, and invite this week?
